

The Musica Universalis : The Celestial Harmony

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The Music of the Spheres

The **Music of the Spheres** and the **Celestial Choir** are two closely related ideas that merge astronomy, philosophy, mythology, and spirituality. The phrase comes from the ancient Greek concept of **Musica Universalis** ("Universal Music"), especially associated with **Pythagoras**. The idea is that the movements of the planets, stars, and heavens follow mathematical ratios similar to those found in musical harmony. The cosmos itself is therefore a vast instrument, playing an eternal symphony. Importantly, this music was not usually thought of as audible sound. Rather, it was:

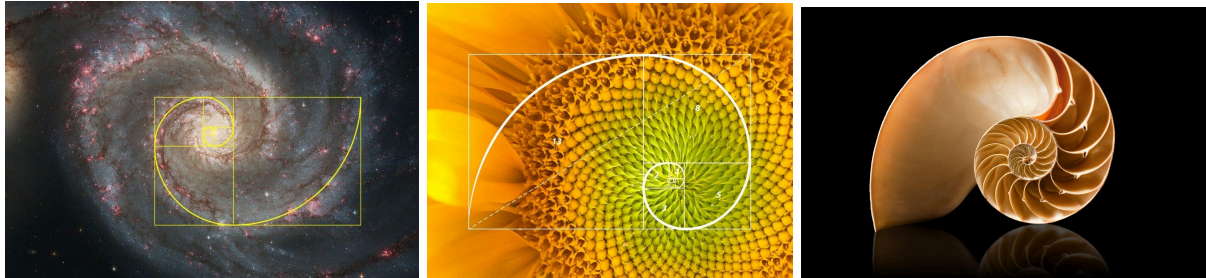
