## Santa Fe Railroad Dining Service

This is a menu from the Santa Fe Railroad dining car service from 1945.

My parents, Helen and Richard Kelchner, were married in 1945 in Berwick, Pa. He had been serving in the U.S. Navy in the Pacific theatre for the previous three years. They traveled by train to Riverside California where they lived for the remaining months of his service. Apparently, my mother saved this menu from the dining car.

It can be dated to the war years by the notice that it carries about wartime price controls enforced by the Office of Price Administration. The numbers in the lower right "1-45" are probably a printing date.

There also is the line: "[Bu]y United States War Savings Bonds and Stamps."
