GREAT MOMS

The GREAT MOMs (Grand Rapids Encompassing Addiction Treatment and Medical Obstetric Management) Model of Care offers pregnant people comprehensive and compassionate care for opioid addiction through outpatient buprenorphine treatment in conjunction with the prenatal care you are providing. Polysubstance Use & Chronic Pain

MOC hosts recurring interactive polysubstance discussions facilitated by addiction specialists and Behavioral Health Consultants. All are welcome to join to share their perspective and experiences treating Opioid Use Disorder and comorbid Substance Use Disorder. We also host webinars specifically related to chronic pain and have developed a resource guide of chronic pain documents.

X-Waiver Support

MOC assists providers with the process of receiving the DEA X-Waiver. We can help providers file for their Notice of Intent to treat up to 30 patients and assist providers with the training requirements for treating >30 patients. MOC hosts a 4-hour introduction to treating patients with buprenorphine training and can connect providers to 8-hour and 16-hour trainings.

Hepatitis C Virus

MOC offers comprehensive education and case consultation on the Hepatitis C Virus (HCV). We can support primary care and community providers with diagnosis, treatment planning, and medication management of people living with HCV. Providers can sign a **brief consulting agreement** to submit cases for review with our lead HCV physician. MOC also hosts biweekly HCV case conferences on Fridays 9-10AM that are targeted toward providers new to HCV treatment. **Contact us** for more information about our HCV support.
