A Word From the Pastor

It has been a busy month! We started July with the Sharon parade. Christ Lutheran was represented by walkers handing out ring pops with VBS info on them, and by a bright new sign with our church name and website carried in the back of Larry Hardt's pick-up truck. Two days after the parade, we welcomed 21 children to VBS who were served by 17 adult and teen volunteers. The following week, three of our youth attended a mission trip to the Leech Lake Indian Reservation in Bemidji, Minnesota. Upon returning, the youth prepared a thank you dinner for those who purchased stock in their trip. In-person indoor Bible study is happening once again. The Lion's Club hosted the blood drive this month, and plans are underway for Sunday school in the fall.

After a year and a half of minimal in-person activities, it feels amazing to be together again, to see faces, to welcome children and youth, to go places, to eat with each other, and to work side by side! Thank you to all who helped with this month's ministries!



As I reflect on this month, I would like to take a moment to share some of the things our youth experienced on the mission trip. We joined two other area churches: Sugar Creek Lutheran in Elkhorn, and Faith Lutheran in Walworth. When we arrived at the mission trip site, a group from a Catholic church was participating as

well. The organization facilitating the trip was called Youth Works. Four college-age women served as our leaders for the week. They directed our youth in preparing and cleaning up after all their meals. The Youth Works leaders also helped arrange our community service opportunities, led the worship and educational activities, and spent time getting to know us. They were fantastic!

The Youth Works leaders led us in a powerful and interactive activity that helped us to understand the devastation suffered by Native American people. We were educated about the ways in which Native Americans were stripped of their land, cultures, and languages. We learned how the Europeans brought deadly diseases, and we heard about the horrors of boarding schools run by the Church. The purpose of these schools was to erase all aspects of Native culture and assimilate Native American children into white culture. The priests and nuns running the schools broke up families. They emotionally,

psychologically, physically, and sexually abused the children, and in far too many cases, children died at these schools, and their deaths were covered up. One of our speaker's family members was pushed down the stairs by a teacher, and the child died as a result. The child who died was 9 years old.

On one of our work days, we stopped by a park to have lunch and there just happened to be a group of people from the Red Lake Nations gathering for a demonstration to raise awareness of what happened at the boarding schools. In particular, their demonstration was to remember babies who had been put in furnaces and killed at the boarding schools. An 80-year-old woman was present and told us her story.



She had attended a boarding school where abuses occurred. She shared that she had been hit in the mouth many times because she dared to speak Ojibwe to her younger brothers and sisters who could not speak English.

Some of the people from the Red Lake Nations group gathered at the entrance of the park for a drum circle. Although they sang in Ojibwe, any listener would know the song was about sorrow and loss. Hearing that song was the most powerful moment of the trip for me, and I think it was for several of the youth as well.



The youth worked hard during community service time, cleaning, moving, fixing, and doing yard work, but the most important work they did was simply being present with people and receiving the gift of others' stories, hospitality, and grace. Those who welcomed us into their spaces were gracious and kind.

We heard from those we served about the things beginning to happen in an effort to

restore the language and culture that has been lost, and to teach the present generation the Ojibwe traditions, values, and life-sustaining skills. When we arrived back, the youth agreed they would do it all over again. God was with us, blessing us through those we met and teaching us many things! My prayer is that the youth who attended continue to listen to the stories of others with humility and openness, and that through others, their understanding of Jesus, the one who so loved the World, will deepen and grow. Thank you for your prayers and support of youth ministry at Christ Lutheran!

A Message From the Council

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Sunday, I announced that a Congregational Meeting will be held on August 8th following worship. The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss and authorize the funding and/or possible financing of the bell tower tuck pointing and a repair project with a drain enlargement project on the flat roof over the front entrance and old Pastor's office.

The tuck pointing of the bell tower is a much needed and important repair in the overall safety and integrity of our building. It has been bid as a possible two part project. The upper fifteen feet or so is in very bad shape and may require rebuilding rather than just tuck pointing. Other options, such as removing this section and capping with a roof may be explored as a more cost effective method of repair. This will be discussed with the contractor after further inspection is done once the project is underway.

The flat roof over the front entrance and old Pastor's office has caused water leaks for many years. The leaks seem to happen in early winter and early spring. The accumulation of snow and ice, freezing and thawing, and rain cause a build-up of water that cannot always drain due to the drain on the roof being frozen shut or blocked by ice and snow. The current drain is about 4" in diameter. The drain will be enlarged to allow drainage during the freezing and thawing seasons.

- The cost of the tuck pointing and roof drain enlargement is Twenty-Nine Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety Seven Dollars. (\$29,397.00)
- The cost of rebuilding the top section of the bell tower if needed is Twenty One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy Nine Dollars. (21,879.00)

Through the years and many important projects, this Congregation has seemed to always rise to the occasion. It is the hope of the Council that we can once again raise the needed funds for this project. We are currently accepting special donations for this project and will continue to do so. Please designate donations with "Bell Tower" noted.

Thank you to all who have supported and continue to support our church and our many projects. We will do our best to pass along information as this project moves forward. Please plan to attend the meeting on August 8th after church.
