A Word From the Pastor

Food is on my mind today. Recent news stories have highlighted the food crisis in Sudan. The war in Ukraine has prevented food from coming into the country. Sudan has been facing famine due to three years of unusual flooding. Children are starving and thousands of people are at risk of losing their lives because of malnutrition.

I admit, I often take food for granted. I have never experienced real hunger, only the occasional trouble focusing if I miss a meal or eat late. When I clean out my fridge, I often end up throwing out food our family couldn't finish before it went bad. While I realize that many people around me are struggling with the higher cost of food, and I am noticing my steep grocery bill, I am by no means hungry. I have always had food. It's shamefully easy for me to forget that food is not guaranteed. But in the days since that news story has come out, I have been noticing food more—how much I have, how little I actually work for it, how much is around me, from fast food restaurants I drive past, to grocery store shelves that are taller than me and and contain every kind of cereal, and canned fruit, and sauce, and spice imaginable, to the full, green, waving fields of corn I see outside my car window on the way to work.

The earth produces more than enough food to feed the world. However, because of many factors such as war preventing transport of goods, corruption in governments, and the truth that climate change most devastatingly affects poor regions of the world that rely on their local land for food, hunger senselessly occurs. We also must realize that hunger is not just an overseas problem. Many of our neighbors suffer from food insecurity. They worry about affording food, and kids in our community don't always know where their next meal will come from.

The Bible tells us that food disparity is against God's plan for creation. The prophets who delivered the Word of God to the people warned the Israelites against hoarding and polluting resources.

From Ezekiel chapter 34, "Is it not enough for you to feed on the good pasture, but you must tread down with your feet the rest of the pasture? When you drink of clear water, must you foul the rest with your feet? And must my sheep eat what you have trodden with your feet, and drink what you have fouled with your feet? ... They shall no more be plunder for the nations...I will provide for them a splendid vegetation so that they shall no more be consumed with hunger in the land."

God cares for the ones who suffer because of others' greed and carelessness. If I am honest with myself, I see myself among the sheep who are running amok through the pastures, taking what is needed for themselves and leaving a path of polluted resources.

I begin to feel overwhelmed by the problem of hunger and the ways in which my own belonging to a wealthy society contributes to the problem. I don't have answers, except that I know that God calls us to be concerned about hunger, to pray about poverty, and to examine how our actions affect others. I also believe it's important to be thankful, to realize that if we are not worrying about food, we are fortunate.

Give thanks for your food. Don't take it for granted. If you are able to help, remember your hungry neighbors, the close ones, and the ones around the world. Consider giving a donation to ELCA World Hunger, or Lutheran World Relief, or consider helping locally. This summer our church is going to be helping our close neighbors by providing kids' lunches during VBS, and distributing kids' lunches Thursdays in August. All human beings are dependent upon the health of God's creation, and the generosity of others. God commands us to love our neighbor. Addressing hunger is a faith practice.
