A Word From the Pastor

Our congregation is currently participating in a process hosted by the synod called Faithful Innovations. The focus of Faithful Innovations is listening, particularly listening to God, listening to each other, and listening to our communities. We have a few members who are attending three trainings throughout the year, and they are going to be inviting us to try some new things that will invite us into deeper listening. I joined a couple of members for our first training on Sunday May 22. The event was held from 2:00-6:00. Pastors are usually tired on Sunday, so I was anticipating the time spent in this four-hour training session to feel long. We spent the afternoon listening. We participated in Dwelling in the Word, which is an exercise in listening deeply to a passage of Scripture. We also took some time to listen to each other tell stories about a time in our lives when we were most spiritually energized.

I found I was not watching the clock. The time was full of connecting and sharing. When I finally did look up at the clock, I was surprised that our time was over. When you are truly listening, and others are sharing from their hearts, you lose track of time. The same is true when you have the wonderful and rare experience of having someone truly listen to you.

When I shared with my listening partner my story, he listened intently. He was able to repeat back to the group everything I said. I felt valued, and I felt my story mattered to him and the group. The validation took me a bit by surprise. I often feel heard when I am with friends, family, and church members, but this listening was even more intentional than usual. The experience inspired me to be more intentional in my listening. I also noticed what a blessing it was to have time and space set aside to listen to others. Freedom from distractions deepened my listening to others.

I have a book on my shelf called, *The Art of Listening in a Healing Way* by James E. Miller. He suggests that healing listening begins with triple intention. If we are to listen in a healing way, whether we consciously or unconsciously make commit to each intention, we say yes to three things—that we will, "do more than merely hear," we will, "listen to this person, in this time, in this moment," and we will, "listen with the other person's needs foremost in mind."

Our culture keeps us from listening in this committed way. We are busy, and our cell phones and devices never stop pinging. We listen with the intention of finding a pause when we can interject with our own comment or story. Sometimes we fail to listen in conflict situations because we are formulating our own points. Listening is rare, and this is unfortunate because listening is ministry. Listening is healing. Listening to others can even be a form of prayer. Often the best prayer is listening, and God speaks through others all the time.

I encourage you to consider how you might listen a little more deeply. Next time you are in a situation when someone reaches out to you and begins sharing the story of their day, see if you can't commit to intentional listening. Your commitment to be present and open, and your intention of listening for the other person's wholeness will be a gift to them. It might even provide some healing! I'm excited to begin Faithful Innovations and to listen more deeply with you to God, each other, and our community! I expect that God has something we are meant to hear!
