A word from the Pastor

This Lent I have been thinking about angels. Until this year, I hadn't given angels of Lent much thought. Normally, we think of them as Advent and Christmas beings. The Angel Gabriel comes to Zechariah in the Temple to tell him he and Elizabeth will have a son, John, who will help prepare the way for Jesus. Gabriel comes to Mary to tell her she will be the mother of Jesus. On the night of Jesus' birth the Angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds to tell them about the birth of a Savior, and the whole sky filled with them. I've always liked my angels tucked away with the Christmas decorations. It seemed like that's where they belonged.

But this Lent, angels are on my mind. Carol Frederick gifted me with a beautiful handmade stole. The print is made of deep purple palm branches. The stole is decorated with a larger cross and a couple of smaller crosses.

Purple, palm branches, and crosses are all symbols we expect to encounter in Lent, but this stole has a surprise. Clear, glassy angels have been lovingly affixed to the fabric. When I see them, I think, teardrop angels!

The first Sunday in Lent this year, I couldn't help but notice that there was a similar surprise in the Gospel text. Angels showed up in the wilderness. Jesus was in the wilderness with the wild beasts, and Satan tempted him for 40 days. It was a true wilderness experience, but in the desolation and the struggle, angels came and waited on him.

Our 40 days of Lent mirror Jesus' time in the wilderness. In a spiritual way, we enter the



wilderness too. We leave the comfort of our safe ideas about God. We ask difficult questions. We contemplate the cross. We remember our mortality, and allow all the questions, fears, and truths of that reality to lead us to God and what is important in life.

The wilderness is a scary place. We are tempted to leave the wilderness and return to our safe and easy ways. The wild beasts confront us—the shadow sides of ourselves, and the pain of sin and suffering in the world. But there in the wilderness, the angels also come to us. They are the presence of God coming to sustain us even when it seems we are completely alone.

The presence of God shows up all kinds of ways. God makes God's presence known in moments when we experience the deep knowing that we are not alone. It shows up through people, through natural beauty, through waves of peace that overtake us, through scripture, through little miracles that get us through the day, sometimes even, and I think this is very common, through animals. God is with us. In the wilderness, God finds us and gives us the strength to make it another day, continue with the hard questions, to see one more thing through.

As I was thinking about Lenten angels, I remembered that there is another incident of Lenten angels in the Bible. On Maundy Thursday, when Jesus was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, the Gospel of Luke records, "Then an angel from heaven came to him and gave him strength." (Luke 22:43)

This Lent, I will be thinking of angels, teardrop angels who understand our trials and struggles, who know what we need, who come to us in the wilderness and find us in Thursday gardens, bearing the abiding love of God. I will be thinking of angels bringing hope and accompaniment as sustaining as bread.

My prayer for you this Lent is that you are visited by these attending angels in exactly the moments you need them.






There are three ways to support them financially:

One of the greatest commissions we as Christians were given is outlined in Matthew 28:19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and son of the Holy Spirit."
