A Word From the Pastor

This morning, I was trying to find a way to record a video on ZOOM that included a slideshow with a voiceover, download it to YouTube, and share it as a link. Within minutes, I had worked out the basics, and I knew my plan was a go. A year ago, I would have never imagined that I would be able to figure out something like that on my own. The pandemic has forced me to expand my technology skills beyond what I thought possible for myself. I still ask for lots of help from our newly formed technology committee. I often contact Mike Dowden with technology questions when I get stuck. He is a great help and never makes me feel embarrassed about what I don't know. Even though I am still a novice, I am amazed at what I have learned. Using technology has become, I can't believe I'm saying this, a little fun.

My small success today came to me after a year of trial and error. It came after the blow of realizing I could no longer get away with ignoring technology as a ministry tool. It came after a year of countless instances of feeling completely lost as to where to even begin. My excitement this morning reminded me how amazing the process of learning truly is.

As disciples, we are constant learners. I Googled the word disciple and found this definition from etymonline.com: one who follows another for the purpose of learning. In Jesus' culture, there were many traveling spiritual teachers who recruited disciples. The disciples were following Jesus to learn from him. They didn't spend time in a classroom. They traveled from city to city, accompanying Jesus as he preached, made friends, cast out demons, and healed people. They learned about God by watching Jesus transform people's lives.

Jesus was teaching them about love, and the journey was not easy, but it was more worth it than anything else on earth. The same is true for us in our discipleship. Jesus is teaching us about love. The journey is not always easy, but it's the most worthwhile journey we'll ever take. We make mistakes. We get stuck. We find ourselves in situations where we don't even know where to begin. We have to ask for help. Sometimes we encounter the difficult truth that if we are going to grow, we have no

choice but to face those challenges we avoid. When we follow Jesus, we are sure to have moments when we need to let go of comfortable, long held, limiting beliefs about God. There will be moments when we realize we've been terribly wrong. We will encounter the cross, but we will rise with Christ.

We are learning about God's love for the whole world. The totality of God's love is difficult for us to grasp. It's hard to wrap our minds around the absolute wonder that God's love is eternal, and it's for everyone--especially those we think don't deserve it. God's love is endless. It's unconditional. It's for us—especially when we think we don't deserve it.

There are so many wonderful things to learn about God's love, and Jesus wants to be our teacher. Life in the church and life as a Christian is about learning to love through Jesus. What have you learned? What are you learning right now? What poses a challenge for you? What lessons have been difficult? When have you been joyfully surprised?

When I left teaching to be a pastor, I knew I would miss the classroom, but I have found that the journey of learning remains integral to my daily work. Life in the church is learning with Jesus. In him, whether we live or die, the learning continues. What subject could be more fulfilling, more fascinating, than the mysteries of love, especially with Jesus as our teacher?
