A Word From the Pastor

When I was growing up, Reformation Day was a big deal. It was celebrated with louder organ music than usual, red paraments on the altar and over the shoulders of the pastor, and a fiery sermon about the insignificance of Halloween compared to the importance of Reformation Day, and usually a diatribe of reasons we Lutherans (particularly our brand of Lutherans) were right and everybody else was wrong. I have to admit, as a kid, I loved Reformation Day.

I was riveted by the story of Martin Luther. I envisioned him going out alone into the cold night, nailing those 95 theses on the old church door, and the Spirit of God blowing in the wind about to change the world. Worshiping under the red of hanging banners and standing in rainbowy light from the stained-glass windows made me feel like I was a kid in the Middle Ages. The best moment was singing, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," as Mr. Westphal, my seventh-grade teacher and our organist played with so much energy it seemed like the walls were expanding an inch or two. And truth be told, I relished believing I was a member of the church that got it right. How wonderful that we had the truth! A little fire burned in me. It was the fire of us *against them*. I sensed the heat. The embers of "*God is on our side*" smoldered. It felt so good to be right.

The Reformation is a mixed bag. We celebrate it because it was the movement that reintroduced us to the Good News that we are saved by grace, not by works, and the power of God's Word was returned to the hands of the people, and so many more Spirit-filled ripple effects that removed the barriers between God and God's people. But the divisions caused violence and hate between people that still live on today.

I grew up believing that Reformation Day is a celebration of triumph. Rightness is not what we celebrate when we celebrate the Reformation. The glory of the Reformation is not our rightness. The glory of the Reformation is the righteousness of Christ who saves us.

When we celebrate the Reformation, we need to be careful that it is not a celebration of our having it right, or a glossing over the divisions and violence. When we celebrate the Reformation, we celebrate the power of the Gospel and the work of the Holy Spirit who continues to reform the church so that all people can come to the table as God intends. We celebrate the unfathomable gift of grace. God loves us, and we are God's children. Jesus, through his death and resurrection, frees us from all that separates us from God's love.

It's easy to enjoy the feeling of being right. The feeling of being right is dangerous. Reformation is about God, who shows us where we're wrong for the sake of love!
