### About Shelby

- Shelby, Michigan is in Oceana County, which is along the shoreline of Lake Michigan.
- Our small community (pop. 2,265) is filled with friendly people, several restaurants, numerous parks, including a rail trail linear park, a full-service hospital, a grocery, a community bank, an excellent school system and much, much more!
- We are surrounded by some of the most beautiful scenery that the State of Michigan offers—sweeping dunes, beautiful Lake Michigan, sundry of inland lakes, orchards and fields. There's beauty everywhere you turn.
- Spring brings the breathtaking beauty of blossoming fruit trees dotting the landscape.
- Summer delights us with warm weather perfect for enjoying the dunes and Lake Michigan, only 7 miles west!
- Fall's spectacular display of hardwoods and orchards turning color will leave you in awe.
- Winters are like you may remember as a kid—perfect for sledding, skiing, snowmobiling and building snowmen! Snowfall is generally above average. You will need a shovel. 😊

## **Overview of Shelby**

Situated in a safe and quiet community a short drive from Lake Michigan, Shelby is home to 2,256 residents. Shelby is conveniently located within a 30-minute drive of both Muskegon (South) and Ludington (North). Downtown Grand Rapids is about one-hour drive away. The Oceana County Seat is six miles north of Shelby in the city of Hart.

The Village of Shelby is a safe, family-friendly community with an excellent K-12 public school system serving the area. Mercy Health operates a 24-hour medical facility including a full-service emergency department.

## **The Community**

The residents of Shelby appreciate the small town, rural feel of their community knowing that the “bright lights” of urban areas are less than an hour drive for entertainment, education, cultural and work opportunities. When air travel is desired, area residents have two major airports (Muskegon and Grand Rapids) within easy driving distance.

Since being founded in the mid-1800’s Shelby has played an important part in the growth of West Michigan. The Shelby Hotel and U.S. Post Office opened in 1864. Rail service was established through Shelby in 1872. The first meeting of the Shelby Village Council was in 1885. The current recreation area next to the Shelby High School was used as a prisoner of war camp for captured Germans in 1944. The 500 men camped there for about six months but made many positive improvements to the area. After WWII, a few of the former prisoners immigrated to West Michigan.

The area offers an abundance of opportunities for recreation including Lake Michigan and inland lakes and rivers for boating, swimming, kayaking, and canoeing, along with parks, trails, golf courses and state gaming areas. The Hart-Montague Rail Trail State Park passes through Shelby providing bicycling (currently an estimated 75,000 bicyclists pass through the Village each year) and snowmobile activities providing scenic landscapes while traveling to neighboring communities.

In addition to being a low-crime, safe community, Shelby offers many amenities that enhance the quality of life for its residents. The Village is home to the Shelby Area District Library, Historic Getty Park and several other unique parks that are available for Shelby residents and visitors to enjoy. Getty Park is adjacent to the School athletic fields the contain ballfields, tennis court, basketball hoops, soccer field and a pavilion.

The Shelby Public School System provides a quality education experience for its 1,200 students in the Shelby Area. Nearby Muskegon Community College (MCC) offers over 75 associate degree and certification programs to area residents in addition to preparing students to move on to four-year college and university degree programs. MCC combines state-of-the-art facilities and technology with its highly qualified instructors, small class sizes and affordable tuition to meet the educational needs of its community. MCC has a vibrant online course presence.

The Village has a classic “downtown” business district with several businesses and restaurants

including the Brown Bear Restaurant, recently named as an MLive's Top Ten Burgers (July 30, 2020) in Michigan!

### **The Organization**

Shelby operates with a traditional council/manager form of local government where all department directors are hired by and report to the Village Administrator. Six non-partisan, at-large Council members serve alternating four-year terms with elections held in even years. The Village President is elected separately and serves for a two-year term.

The Council appoints the Administrator, sets policy and direction, approves the budget and major expenditures while serving as the legislative authority through the approval of ordinances and major planning initiatives.

The Village provides a range of municipal services including police protection, water, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, streets, building maintenance, park and recreational facilities, and code enforcement. Fire protection is provided by Shelby Township. Refuse collection is provided by a private company, and Assessor duties are performed by a contracted third party. Oceana County provides building and related inspection services in the Village.

In addition to the Village Administrator, the administrative team includes the Police Chief, Public Works Director, Clerk/Treasurer, and an Administrative Assistant. An efficient staff of eight fulltime and seven regular part-time employees make up the municipal work force in Shelby. The Village offices are housed Downtown.

Village Council meetings are held every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of every month unless a special council meeting is requested. Planning Commission meet every 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of every month unless a special meeting is requested. Communities Overcoming Violent Encounters (COVE) was established to provide shelter, protection, and advocacy to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.



When a crisis occurs anywhere in Oceana County, Emergency Management officials must be able to reach residents with warnings, information, and updates. In order to ensure that residents can be contacted quickly and effectively, the County has begun using the CodeRED Emergency Notification System, which gives Emergency Management the ability to call thousands of residents within minutes. Whether residents need to be informed of a water main break, approaching storm, or other crisis, this notification system is an efficient way to reach them with the news. ## William Field Memorial Hart-Montague Rail Trail



The trail is a paved rail-trail which extends for 23.5 miles, covering 225 acres, from Hart to Whitehall at the southern end. It is open to hiking, biking, in-line skating, skiing, and if there are 4+ inches of snow, snowmobiling. The entire trail is accessible. It is also marked as being open to dog-sledding south of Rothbury. The trail is a linear State Park following the former line of the Grand Rapids and Lakeshore RR Company. This was taken over by the Chicago and West Michigan RR, then the C&O which abandoned the line in 1982. Various services are available as it passes through small towns.

The Shelby Trailhead is on the site of the old depot, but that structure is gone. There is ample parking for cars (not for long vehicles), water, a porta-potty, pavilion and picnic tables. Restaurants are a short walk from the trailhead. The Shelby Trailhead has information on the kiosk about the history of the railroads.

**Access-** Parking available directly beside the trail at the Shelby Trailhead.

**Restrictions-** No hunting on or from the trail (although portions of the trail pass through lands which are open to hunting), no motorized vehicles, no horses.

## Village of Shelby Parks

### Getty Park



Historic Getty Park & Getty Field was deeded over to the Village by George B. Getty and Sarah J. Getty in 1908. It is located on 6th Street, running along both sides of School Street. The park includes tennis courts, basketball courts, a ball diamond, soccer field, a playground, and picnic tables. It's popular with the youth of the community.

### Horseshoe Park



In 2012 Horseshoe Park was created with recreation and tournaments in mind! The Park was recently given the name of Nichols Horseshoe Park for Shelby resident Lou Nichols involvement in getting it developed. The horseshoe tournaments are held in the warmer months, Saturday from 10:30 am until teams are finished. The public is always welcome.

### Mead Park



Mead Park is a 33-acre park bisected by a primary county road and has a baseball field and a parking area that serves both the Park and Shelby Optimist Club building. The west end of the park is adjacent to the William Field Memorial Hart-Montague Trail; Piper Creek also meanders throughout Mead Park.

### Memorial Park



Memorial Park was one of Shelby's First Parks, created in 1903. The park is located at State, Third and Maple and features picnic tables, benches, a monument, and a canon!

## Tank Park



Tank Park is located on 6th Street and Industrial Park Drive. Take time to sit at the park benches or picnic tables to rest and reflect.

## Wesco Park



Wesco Park is located at State St. and Fourth. Lots of folks walk to local businesses, and this park gives you a minute to rest in the shade.

## Soccer Park



Soccer Park is located at Walnut St. and 5th Street. This park has soccer goals, abundant green space to run & play, and picnic tables under the trees to take a minute to rest as you ride along the beautiful William Field Memorial Hart-Montague Trail.
