Remembrance of Baptism

- P** In Holy Baptism *Janice* was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all *her* sin. St. Paul says: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"

P Receive our thanks for Janice and for all the blessings You bestowed on her in this earthly life. Bring us at last to our heavenly home that with her we may see You face to face in the joys of paradise. Lord, in Your mercy,

P O God of all grace, You sent Your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, to bring life and immortality to light. We give You thanks that by His death He destroyed the power of death and by His resurrection He opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers. Janice Childs Weikert, age 59, of Oak Point, Texas, passed away July 6, 2024, in Dallas, Texas after a year-long battle with cancer.
