Why MasterLife Ministry, Inc.?

I am Travis Mileur, President of *MasterLife Ministry*, *Inc.*, God Bless all of you, we give all praise and glory to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, without Him we can do nothing.

This is our first newsletter since being officially recognized as a non-profit organization. We would like to thank all of the people that have supported this ministry: present administration, family, friends, incarcerated disciples and disciple makers, and the men who have been released that have supported *MasterLife Ministry*.

What is the purpose in MasterLife Ministry becoming a non-profit? The goal is for us to become equipped with the finances to assist more of you to do what James Benoy has been doing for the past 14 years - learning how to Master Life In Prison by discipling other Christians, evangelizing the general prison population, creating a positive environment in the dorm, and connecting Christian inmates with mentors on the outside. There is more involved in this process than having a Bible study in the day room. So, how has Benoy been successful in his efforts? By utilizing what is now MasterLife Ministry resources to build community, make burritos in the dorm, have a Christmas party and talent shows, and creates small group studies. Eventually, the local church volunteers join in and corporately hold a 13-week discipleship program in the chapel or gym, a 13-week program especially designed for general population.

I share this with you, not to exalt Benoy but show you the heart of *MasterLife Ministry* and what prison ministry looks like from the inside and recognize that there are other faithful men (like Tim, Fish, Craig, and many others) inside who give it all for the cause of Christ. They have ministry ideas and spiritual gifts and no platform of support. *MasterLife Ministry, Inc.* is incorporated in the hopes that we can become equipped to help more faithful men on the mission field inside, *Mastering Life Through the Power of Jesus Christ in Prison*.

Are You Really Listening?

Listen to me! Listen to me. *Listennnnnn to*

I NEED YOU TO LISTEN TO ME.

I need you to care about what I care about for a moment* So please listen 2 me

During my childhood, my family moved all over North Carolina. Lake Lure, Chimney Rock, Apex, White Lake, Southern Pines, Fayetteville, Carolina Beach, Shelby, and Gastonia have all been my hometowns at

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some point. I've lived in the projects, the trailer parks, the mountains, the city, and the country. My father's side of the family was military, law enforcement, state government. and politics; while my mother's side of family were preachers, farmers, millworkers, convicts, and drug dealers. My brother Michael and I were not deprived or neglected as children. We never had to wonder if we would have a safe home, if the bills would be paid, or if food would be on the table; Dad always provided. He also taught us right from wrong. We were just stubborn and strong-willed children who were determined to do what we wanted.

At eighteen years old I got on crack cocaine. This led me into a life of crime. I started getting locked up in 1989, and it has been in and out of prison ever since. In prison, I was the super-tough convict (legend in my own mind), but, when I'd get out, I was a lying thieving crackhead who ruined my family name. I went from being a normal kid from a good family, to career criminal travelling across the United States robbing drug dealers, not caring if I lived or died. The local newspaper quoted the district attorney saying that had the "worst criminal records that he has ever seen" (Shelby Star, 2010). I spent years hurting the people who loved me until eventually they all disappeared from my life, after five trips to prison, in four different states, ruining three marriages, and abandoning two children, I finally broke down to the one true Savior of the world—Jesus Christ.

I got saved on October 2005. I woke up in jail in Dallas, Texas and for the first time in my life, I was broken, broken to the point of suicide. I began to cry out to God and tell Him that I was tired of my life, tired of hurting my family, tired of lying, stealing, and cheating hard-working law-abiding citizens; tired of being a no-good piece of dung! I told Him that I have been wrong for so long and I was sorry for sinning against Him. I told Him that He could have my life if He would just fix me, save me, and give me peace. At that moment, something happened to me and in my sobs, a peace came over me, that flooded my soul and after what seemed like hours I got up from the floor and went into the day room of the jail where a man gave me a Bible; inside the Bible was a track and the first words read in bold print was: "If any man is in Christ, he is a new creature, old things have passed away, behold all things have become new" (2 Cor. 5:17). I believed that God spoke to me at that moment, the peace that I had longed for was now a reality, I did not know what had just happened to me, but my life hasn't been the same since.

Well, I went to prison in Texas not really understanding that I had just given my life to Jesus in that jail. I knew that something had happened to me but did not know what to do with this new change I felt in my heart. Nevertheless, God knew what He was doing; while I was there God provided me with a mentor, an older black gentleman, Lynn. He began to disciple me, explaining the gospel, helping me break through years of shame, guilt, warped ideologies, and faulty worldviews. Lynn quickly gained my respect because he accepted me where I was at and let me grow on my own. He just lived the Christian life in front of me. The greatest impact he made on me was by following up after he got out of prison by continuing to write, encourage, and support me, this is unheard of in the prison system. God was definitely at work in my life. I spent that two years reading the Bible, attending church, and going to MasterLife.

If you are thinking of ways to fix my problem, you are not listening to me*

The History of MasterLife

Travis Mileur, president of MasterLife Ministry, Inc., came into Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) and taught a 24-week MasterLife Discipleship workbook study written by Avery T. Willis. I attended the program and memorized the tools that were assigned. Later, after leaving Texas, Travis reached out to me and continued to disciple me. His follow-up in my discipleship has been a key element in my personal growth as a Christian and in the success of this ministry. Mastering Life in Prison began, in a small-town jail in Georgia, as a Bible study for five inmates who could not read or write. Since then, it has grown into an effective lifechanging prison program.

After I was released from TDCJ. I went to Georgia where I was incarcerated for two years. While in the county jail, I was approached by a man who asked me if I would help him read the Bible. Without hesitation I agreed not knowing what God was about to do in my life. After our first meeting, others began to join in. They began to ask if I would teach them more about the Bible. I was nervous and didn't know where to start, however, I remembered the MasterLife tools that had memorized in Texas. So, I sat in my cell and began to write out those tools, using the Bible, and my own experiences to disciple the men in my cell block. As I continued to teach, I began to develop a group study that involved: scripture memory verses, memorizing the books of the Bible, prayer. reading the Word, fellowshipping, and witnessing. God gave me a simple illustration explaining the war between the flesh and the Spirit with practical tools to overcome the flesh; putting on the armor of God before the battles of life come at us; finally, how to reach out to others and disciple them. For one year in that jail, God began to develop my abilities and give me the confidence to do His work.

I began to realize that a major problem in society was not the message of Christ, but, that people have faulty ideas about the Christian walk because they have never been taught "what to do next!" Men and women get saved, but no one comes alongside them and disciples them, teaching them how to have a personal relationship with the Lord. They do not know what quiet time, "how to" hear God's voice, pray or put on the armor of God. Furthermore, many people do not realize that God has a very practical plan to involve them in His work here on Earth, a plan that coincides with their normal daily life. Since I have spent most of my life in the prison environment and understand the mentality of the people, I have been able to develop Mastering Life in Prison into a program that reaches the inmates in their context & lingo. After finishing the teachings, I would have a completion party with food, trivia game, Bible drills and memory verses. Prizes and certificates were rewarded.

Men were learning how easy it is for them to have a relationship with the Lord, their lives began to change and the entire dorm began to transform into a peaceful atmosphere, an atmosphere that was noticed by the jail staff. Eventually the captain of the jail began to allow the block to be called the faith-based dorm. Many people would request to be moved in the dorm. We would watch preaching on TV all morning, turn the TV off all afternoon, and have our group study, and guys spent hours in private devotion and Bible study most evenings. They loved it and I was having the time of my life! Men's families would write to me and visit me expressing their gratitude for helping their son, brother, or father. This was a very humbling experience and I give glory to Jesus Christ for all that He has done for them and revealed to me during all of this. I have so many stories I could share from that tine: it was truly an awesome time in my life.

After my transition from jail to prison in Georgia, I continued to teach discipleship groups, build relationships, reaching out to men and held small groups in the dorms. The groups began to grow to the point where more space was needed. Being the staff barber, I had the ear of the warden, I prayed the prayer of Nehemiah. The next time the warden came for a haircut, I told him my problem. God heard me and the warden

granted me permission to hold the group in the gym. The turnout was unbelievable and was now speaking to a crowd for the first time my life!

Shortly after, I was transferred to jail in North Carolina for charges that I had pending on me. While awaiting trial, I began to do what I've been doing—Mastering Life through the power of Jesus Christ. Once again, I was given a cellblock to teach the program in this jail. I repeated what I was doing in Georgia and the jail staff was amazed at the transformation of the entire jail. For the next six months I

preached to the lost, counseled the broken, nursed the sick, and discipled everyone who came into my cellblock. The power and presence of the Lord was with me in everything that I did.

I was sentenced to twenty-five years for habitual offender and transferred to Central Prison for processing. At first, I was so staggered by the amount of time I was given, that I struggled to pick up the Bible for a couple of days. However, I soon realized that there is nowhere else to turn, once a person partakes of the goodness of the Lord there is no other life to go back to! I began to place my focus back on Jesus and this new mission field that He had entrusted to me. At that point, I was truly freed from prison forever; I was now on the mission field for Christ.

Alexander Correctional is where I began to reach out again. After a chain of adventurous events, God gave me favor with the superintendent. He granted permission for MasterLife to be taught in the dorm and allowed workbooks and supplies to be mailed into the chaplain's office. This is when I began to teach Avery Willis' workbook study to the more dedicated men while still teaching my Mastering Life in Prison Program to everyone in dorm who wanted to be involved. Not everyone who participated became a follower of Christ; but, they memorized key scriptures verses and the books of the Bible, they heard a clear presentation of the gospel, and they know how to start a relationship with the Lord if they ever turn their life over to Him. This made it all worthwhile.

Back in the day, there were two prisons that a didn't want to be transferred to—Avery Mitchell Correctional and Caledonia Correctional. Well, Avery Mitchell and Caledonia here I come and Mastering Life in Prison is coming with me!

The next stop on the mission field was Avery Mitchell Correctional. While I was on the transfer bus, I began to pray for the favor of the administration. Three weeks later I found myself sitting in the superintendent's office telling him all about my adventures and how God's plan for my life was unfolding. He approved for me to use the chapel to hold a Mastering Life in Prison Program. The Chapel was packed with over 100 men interested in learning how Jesus had changed my life. I found that I already knew about one-third of the population from my past, a past in which was living "hard on the yard" (living in sin). These men were shocked to see the changes that God had to my life and my worldview. Some persecuted me, others got bored with the whole idea of Jesus; but many men are

faithfully serving Jesus as a result of this program. I am in touch with several guys who are now free and living for the Lord outside of the confines of these walls.

Caledonia was my next stop on this great adventure. At Caledonia, I was assigned to the worst dorm that one could be housed. So, I began to pray that God would give me a job where I could bear fruit and a dorm where I could study. I wanted access to the men all over the population, so I prayed for a gym job, dog trainer job, or barber job because these job placements would give me access to most of the general population. I told God that I would use the job as a platform to build relationships in hopes that I would be able to disciple them through MasterLife. I also prayed that God would open up an opportunity for a Mastering Life in Prison Program at Caledonia. What happened next was of course God's strategic plan. Not only did I get offered a gym job, dog job, and barber job all in the same day, buts I was called to the chaplain's office and found that my brother had worked with him years ago. Once again God was giving me favor and opening doors. I accepted the barber job and was approved by the Superintendent to pilot a Mastering Life in Prison Program. The first class had twenty-two on the role; the second had approximately seventy men attending causing it to be moved to the gym for more space; the third had over one-hundred men. Men were being saved, families restored, the prison environment was changing, the superintendents were pleased, and the Lord Jesus Christ was being glorified.

At Caledonia, God gave me the vision for the MasterLife newsletter and the Adopt-A-Life ministry. The newsletter is a way for the brothers to encourage one another, be encouraged, and have a purpose in ministry while incarcerated. It also provides a way for the families and churches to witness the changes that are taking place behind these fences. Adopt-A-Life is designed to connect faithful disciple-making inmates with faithful co-laborers on the outside. The goal of this is to have a mentor and ministry partner who will encourage and support the man on the front lines. Though Adopt-A-Life ministry doesn't bring much recognition, the fruit it bears is plentiful and rewarding, the relationship I have with Travis and my family have the catalyst from which the Adopt-A-Life idea birthed.

The next stop in my story is almost unbelievable; however, God makes all things possible—Bible college and the North Carolina Field Minister Program. During every MasterLife program, we show a documentary of the Louisiana Angola Seminary Program. We prayed that God

would bring this program to the North Carolina Department of Public Safety. Once again God answered a prayer that has changed my life and added another chapter to my life testimony. I was honored to be selected as one of the first class out of onethousand eligible inmates. But I was even more humbled that my superintendents, program director, and case managers would all write me recommendations. God has truly changed me from the person I used to be. At Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, I a tremendous amount of information, information that has equipped me for maximum effectiveness in future ministry. Had it not been for Travis, MasterLife, The College at Southeastern, Joe Gibbs' Game Plan for Life, and DPS I would not have been equipped to write this program. Glory be to our Lord Jesus Christ in whom I can do all things.

My vision and life mission is to develop "MasterLife dorms" in every prison, open "Master Houses" for assisting inmates transition back into society, connect Christian mentors with Christian inmates, and to give a copy of Mastering Life In Prison to every inmate behind these fences in hopes that they will learn to Master Life through the power of Jesus Christ. This cannot be done without the help of faithful men and women of God—you!

The Purpose of Mastering Life in Prison

Mastering Life in Prison is a discipleship program sponsored by MasterLife Ministry. Inc. and written by inmate and student of the College at Southeastern James Benoy. In the United States, there are currently more than 6.9 million adults under correctional supervision, with 2.23 million behind bars (Colley 20 13, 7). Some of them will be released back into society one day, while others will never return to the free world again. Many of these men and women are trapped in a revolving door cycle, a cycle that they do not know how to escape.

The church commissions faithful volunteers to come into the prisons, holding church services and Bible studies in an attempt to help these men and women make the changes needed to become productive members of society, however, volunteers are limited in what they can do, For instance, they cannot get involved personally or invest quality time in the lives of individual inmates, therefore, there is a serious lack of mentoring and discipleship within the prison system. This brings forth an important question: who is evangelizing and discipling the men and women behind these fences? And what are they being indoctrinated with? Be assured,

they are being disciple/indoctrinated by someone. The codes, creeds, ideologies, and worldviews that are taught within the prison system are creating more problems than solutions and many inmates are returning to society, in worse condition than when they left. How can policy makers remedy these problems? They have never lived in the prison context nor do they understand the ideological belief systems held by the criminal element of society. Maybe the solution lies within the advice of the incarcerated. Well, I have found a solution, a solution that has proven successful—prison discipleship. Avery Willis describes Christian discipleship as "the process in which the Lord Jesus Christ changes our character into Christ-like character, change our values into kingdom values, and involve us in His mission in the home, the church and the world and I would add, "and the prisons."

After investing more than twenty-five years of my life behind bars, I have developed an understanding of the kinds of ideologies and issues that plaque the prison systems. have written Mastering Life in Prison in an attempt to expose faulty worldviews that are created behind bars and teach others how to Master Life through the power of Jesus Christ. This is accomplished by discussing ideological belief systems, presenting the gospel to the lost population, teaching Christians how to begin the Christian walk, discovering purpose as one uses their spiritual gifts serving within the body of Christ, creating a positive community within the prison system, and connecting them with members of society who wish to mentor and co-labor by Adopting-A-Life.

Until the incarcerated are discipled by Christian mentors and given a purpose by God there is not much hope for a positive transition back into society. Most incarcerated persons have never been properly parented, much less discipled. Therefore, the missing link is getting them connected with true Christians who are willing to get involved, Christians like Ananias who took on the task of discipling Paul (Acts 9).

If you are trying to console me with the "THAT'S NOT SO BAD" method or "LET'S BE GRATEFUL" pitch YOU ARE NOT LISTENING TO ME.

History shows that by indoctrination great societies have been built, however, the other side of that coin is that indoctrination has developed some terrible societies as well. Who's indoctrinating our incarcerated people? *MasterLife Ministry, Inc.* would like to

step into the ring and make a difference. We hope you decide to join us.

This material and information can be used to disciple others in the dorm, on the yard, in visitation or on the phone. Whether it's a one-to-one discipleship, small scale group or one goes somewhere and has a large program, one will know how to organize and execute their own discipleship program. Whatever area of Spiritual growth one might need, MasterLife offers help. We believe these are some key components in doing the 'great commission' and in preparing inmates to become positive and productive members of society. In doing so, we are able to glorify the Lord as we learn to master life through the power of Jesus Christ.

You may be reading this and think this sounds great but I can't do this, or I'm not qualified to do something like this. Maybe you think that only preachers, pastors, and evangelist who have been to college can do this kind of work for the Lord. Let me encourage you that Jesus said that He "chose you and ordained you that you should go and bring forth fruit" (Jn. 15:16). Ask yourself: Do I have a testimony? Do I pray to the Father on a daily basis? Do I read the Word daily? Do I hear Him communicate to me personally when I read the Word? Do I obey Him to the best of my ability? Do I attend church and involve myself with Christian fellowship? Does my life testify that I am a Christian by my lifestyle and my communication with others? Brother, if you can honestly answer these questions in the affirmative then you are qualified to teach others to MasterLife through the power of Jesus Christ in Prison. Oh! And ask yourself one more question: Who else is going to do it? The government? The schools? The self-help programs? Nah, I don't think so. Yeah, if it's gonna get done, it's gonna have to be YOU! *********

The Harvest Truly is Plenteous

Seeing it the way God sees it makes all the difference; I doubt anyone has ever said anything good about Tabor Correctional Institute, and if they did, I've certainly never heard it. A place known for its super strict policies and zero tolerance of violations of the rules, makes it a very unpopular prison to be assigned to. With almost 2000 men assigned here ranging from I-CON to Minimum Custody levels, one can imagine the structure it must take to prevent complete chaos controlling. Yes, it's a tough place to be, and your ability to cope and to adapt will be

pushed to the limit. It's also true that most men here do find themselves frustrated and angry, and negative attitudes prevail as everyone hopes and longs for change. It is because of this desire for change that makes the hope of the gospel of light in a dark place. Of course, the change that most men seek here is a change in location away from this prison, (and that is understandable). But their desire for change creates the opportunity for the presentation of the good news and the path to real change that comes only through Jesus Christ. The harvest is plenteous, and I see dry bones being made alive, and Tabor Correctional becoming a testament of God's ability to do the impossible! Some people may say that Bro. Tim has gone to Tabor City and lost his mind, and to that I guess I would have to somewhat agree, because who in their natural state of mind could face such overwhelming circumstances, endure such hardship, and be placed in such a negative environment and still find hope. I was uprooted without warning from a place I thrived in, where I was being used to bring a message of hope to many people, and I was brought to this place with a still grieving heart after the news of my mother's death only two weeks prior. Upon arriving here, I was stripped of many personal possessions and made to destroy a great deal of photos that were irreplaceable (many of my mother), told to destroy hundreds of dollars' worth of books and canteen items, and then placed in a cell block with almost one hundred men of mostly gang members. How could I possibly be in a natural state of mind after all these circumstances, and still have the conviction to say that this is a land of great opportunity for the Lord. Surely, I must be out of my mind when saying this, and I boldly confess that I am out of my mind (thank God). For I have taken on the mind of Christ and I look beyond the natural and see it the way God sees it!

From the natural view, Tabor Correctional would be seen as a valley of spiritually dead men but looking at it through God's eyes it is seen as a place of living souls ready to be instructed in the ways of the Lord. It is undeniable that I am having a Joseph kind of experience being transferred here from Caledonia, as I choose spiritual correctness over political correctness. However, I do take comfort knowing the end of Joseph's story as he makes the claim: "ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto good, to bring to pass as it is this day, to save much people alive". The Lord is going to do some mighty things here at Tabor Correctional, and I am just blessed to be a part of this great movement. I've learned that there is nothing or no one that can stop the movement of God and when He begins a work, He will surely complete it. I am committed to sharing and

spreading the message of hope only in Jesus Christ, and MasterLife has given us all a platform to do this. So, if I have to disciple one man at a time until I've reached all who will listen, I'll do it. I've only been here a few weeks and have already shared the Disciple's Cross with three or four men who were eager to learn, and I believe that God will send many more. My natural view of Tabor Correctional is based upon the natural things that are; seen, but the view that God reveals is spiritually based and will be manifested in the natural. To put it plainly, "what is impossible to man is possible to God" and seeing it the way God sees it makes all the difference. So, you hear it today if you never hear it again, that there is something good happening here at Tabor, and I (Bro. Tim) am excited about what the Lord has in store. I am already being considered for a custody promotion to minimum and administration seems to think my chances are good to be given favor in this matter. I will keep the MasterLife family posted on what happens.

To my brothers at Caledonia and Nash, I encourage you to keep up the fight and never give up or turn back. I consider it a pleasure to have co-labored in this ministry with you and know that the Lord will keep you. Thanks to the entire **MasterLife** family for you love and support.

My name is Douglas Spearman, but everyone calls me Bear. I've been at Tabor CI for almost 4 years and I have been a born-again Christian now for a number of years. I can say that I've had my ups and downs, disappointments, I've been lied on and talked about, and there are times I have just wanted to throw in the towel. But I get on my knees and ask in Jesus name to give me strength to keep going. I took my work release money and spent the vast majority on my son and my mom's house when I got out. I wanted to stay off drugs, but I had laid my Bible down, and soon I was breaking my vows to God. Four months later, someone who had been on work-release with me came to the house and it only took 3 shots of dope and I was back in jail trying to figure out what had happened. It was that same month in April of 2018 that I decided I was going to make a real lasting commitment to Christ. Since that moment I did my very best to stay in the Word and do what's Right, Good and Pleasing in my Lord God and Savior's eyes! But I could not understand why I seemed to be spinning my wheels with no lasting peace and joy. I always seemed to have this emptiness inside me. Then my prayers were answered when God sent Tim Jones to my aid. GLORY TO GOD. The moment Tim Jones walked into the cell; I felt a sense of peace. I am at a prison I'm sure everyone has heard of. The Door

My brothers in Christ, to be a leader, one must first be a servant. The poor in spirit, the mourners, the meek, the pure in heart, they that hunger and thirst after righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, the persecuted and reviled for righteousness... these are those that Jesus called blessed. The world calls these weak, undesirable, even unattainable. Our Savior embodied each, the very Son of God modeled humility, made Himself a servant among men. He washed our feet, bound and healed our wounds, our sicknesses, touched the very face of an unclean leper. He, there from the beginning, submitted to the will of the Father and died violently under the weight of our sins. To be a disciple, one must follow Jesus. To follow Jesus, we follow not just His teaching, but His example. This is not theology, not religion, certainly not philosophy. To be a disciple one must be a servant in humility and meekness, that is submission to God.

When I was locked up, I served myself. I raged that evening like a beast. I broke the light, beat the walls, the door until my hand bruised, until they chained me to the bench in the next cell. I screamed, I cussed, I wanted my phone, my lawyer, my bail bondsman. More than anything, I wanted more alcohol... just one more shot to make it stop.

I was not looking for God when I was locked up, but, like Paul heading down the road to another destination, I headed straight toward Him. And like Paul, He struck me from my horse, blinding me not with scales, but with concrete, iron and steel gray fences. Desperate, abandoned, hopeless, helpless and suicidal, thinking God Himself had

forsaken me, with nothing but a battered Bible and a veil of tears, He drove me to my knees on a cold concrete floor. In a world of 23 and 1 lock-down, bloody beatings with breakfast trays, hunger, cold and withdrawals, sobbing and screaming, I found repentance. I found salvation and faith. God forged a relationship with me. It has not been an easy path. At one point, nearly giving up, I hung myself in the Durham County Jail. But for God, I am arrogant, stubborn, impatient and insecure. But He is not done with me!

When I started MasterLife, I did not know what to expect. Often in the church, in prison or out, one finds legalism or those that use Christ's liberty as a license for immorality as Paul warned, neither extreme understanding the true balance of God's grace. What I found was truly amazing, as God revealed the power of His Holy Spirit working between and among believers. I watched as "hardened" men stepped up to positions unexpectedly, men stepped down from positions in humility and submission. I witnessed men speak who'd never spoken before a crowd, men reconcile and ask forgiveness of one another. I saw grace extended and the love of Christ administered. Whatever the enemy used to create division and distraction from beginning to end, God used His glory and for our promotion and illustration.

As I walk this path, I sometimes get tired. I get lonely, I miss my son, Matthew, and my family. Sometimes I get discouraged or impatient. I don't always understand why God chooses one path over another; I can't see the whole picture like He can. But I have to rely by faith on His strength, His sight, His vision for my life. It is my job to submit meekly to His will in humility, to be a servant to my God and my neighbor, to display the fruit of the Spirit. If I cannot be a servant, then it is impossible for me to be a disciple. If I cannot learn to follow, then I cannot lead. I thank God for this time at Caledonia and everything He is doing in my life and the lives of my brothers. I encourage you all to seek the Lord with all of your heart. We must be willing to touch the face of the leper.

Church has been great, even though I don't go as often as I should but that's not stopping me from serving God. I thank God for blessing me to get the job I have at this

Also, laid in the casket, was my Mom's last Mother's Day card to give her and I said "Mom, here is your Mother's Day card you never had a chance to read it, so Mom take it with you to heaven." Before my Mom's passing away, I used to lay in bed at night saying my prayers. My Mom's death was a wake-up call to me, now this is what "brought me to my knees to pray" more. MasterLife, I thank God for taking it, this has brought me closer to God.

I was a sex addict and I didn't care who knew or what people knew about me. I wanted to look at the movies on TV with sex in it or look at girly books, you name it, I did it in my life. Drugs used to be part of my life, in society, drugs almost killed me, but I have been clean now 20 years. God will set you free, He will remove both drug addiction and sex addiction, He will remove the shame and the guilt, He, Jesus Christ, will show you your worth and allow you to see you are a somebody, His child.

Growing up before prison, people abused me, beat me, and I was molested by people in my own family, and by a church member. I hated my life, trusted nobody, I was scared, ashamed, and had no help, nobody cared, it seemed to me. People would say I love you William but the next minute, beat me or molest me and act as if, I did wrong, not them. I committed a crime at 16 years old and got charged at 17 years old, cost me 20 years of my life in prison. I'm serving time for myself and two other people. I am sharing my testimony for you who are in a struggle. My God said I came to set you free from your pain, set you free from shame, guilt and anger, set you free from addiction in your life. Give your heart to God, He will give you the strength to overcome your struggle, I promise.

The devil comes to kill, steal, and destroy, to keep you down, to keep you in your addiction, to bring up your past, to bring up what happen to you, but you are no longer that man. 2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore if any be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away behold all things have become new, not some of you, it means all of you.

Quiet Time with the Master

I was a wanderer who strayed from the path of God aimlessly, not thinking about the impact my impression made on others. My name is Loren Hammonds and I am from Whiteville, North Carolina. Before coming to prison, my life was a constant

rollercoaster of ups and downs, in season and out of season. And it didn't stop there, because once I became locked up, my life consisted of the same problems. You see, I was a Christian like most of you who went to church every Sunday and threw the Bible on the table for the rest of the week to collect dust. Nobody taught me any different, for this was all I knew. One day I was led to pick up my Bible and read it, what I found changed the direction of my life forever. Christ teaches in Matthew that "A good tree brings forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree brings forth bad fruit" (Mt. 7:17-20). Showing proof that what our lives produce, points to Christ for the world to see. My life in no way illustrated good fruit and not once did it direct people to know Jesus. This scared me to death and made me think hard about my life and where it was headed, either to heaven or to hell.

So, I began to read God's Word more and go to church. Eventually it led me to Nash Correctional where I was accepted into the College at Southeastern. Day after day, God was nudging me closer to Him, while the teachers were teaching valuable information that stirred my heart strings. Yet, I found myself beginning to fall away from what little relationship I had with God. Why one might ask? Because I cared more about grades than a relationship with God. School became my god and it consumed every area of my life, while destroying the relationships I had with those involved in seminary. The more I ran from God, the more He pursued me. He began speaking to me about MasterLife being taught here in my block at Nash Prison. From the outside looking in, I would start to see dramatic changes in the lives of these men who were involved in the MasterLife groups. I wanted to feel like they felt, but I was unwilling to up my time due to selfishness.

As I grew farther from the Lord, there was a constant battle going on within me. All of a sudden, it's like every emotion I had come down, unraveling and exposing how messed up I was on the inside. I was asked to participate in the MasterLife ministry, and it has helped tremendously in teaching me how to master my emotions by allowing the Holy Spirit to work through my life in gaining victory. As I started conquering these emotions with the help of the Holy Spirit, it was like a weight came off my shoulders and I began to feel a peace wash over me on the inside for the first time. At the heart of the MasterLife ministry is quiet time. Quiet time consist of spending time with God. Many people rush out the door everyday who call themselves Christians yet fail to spend time

Telling you and others "you can't do this" offend people, but a man with two other men can put a rug on the floor and pray to a god that brings death to Christians, considers us followers of Christ as infidels, and think we should be killed and purged from the earth that came from their mouth, but the CO's don't say a thing to them. I tell you brother in my own words, it ain't right!

I've put in my transfer to Nash, but the backlog is long! 2 years they say! It's okay, I know God ain't done with me here.

My name is Deryl W. Odom and I am from Durham N.C. At the age of 15 years old, I start getting into trouble, and I start robbing stores and I got hooked. It made me feel like somebody. I got lock up in training school a few times, but I was still getting out and doing the same thing. So, at the age of 15 years old, I went to the DOC with 12 years. Jesus Christ: God's Provision for Sin

Easter is the glorious celebration of the life, death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We rejoice in His willing sacrifice because as fallen and sinful mankind we had a costly sin debt before God that we could never pay. Not by our works, not by

man's religion, and not by supposed righteousness on our part. Therefore, God graciously and lovingly provided for us a substitute. Though we had a debt we could never pay, God came in the flesh to pay a debt He did not owe. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is the one and only provision for sin. Salvation is found in none other. He is our perfect and spotless Lamb of God who rose from the dead on our behalf that glorious third day conquering sin, death, and the grave.

We see glimpses of this provision of sacrifice throughout the Old Testament. We then find its completion in our savior's death, burial and resurrection.

In Genesis you may recall Abraham and Isaac on Mt. Moriah. Abraham was told by God: "take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love ..." to be offered as a faith-testing sacrifice on the mountain. Isaac wisely noted there was both fire and wood, "but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" (Genesis 22:2-8). Here we see God's divine providence in both providing and allowing the substitutionary death of one life in the place of another. Here, a lamb would be a sufficient sacrifice for an individual.

In Exodus we find the first Passover. You know the story. The Israelites were to sacrifice a "lamb without blemish" and then apply the blood over the doorposts, thus sparing them from the angel of death and the judgement God was declaring against Egypt at this time. This event of sovereign redemption and mercy was so significant to God that He changed their calendar (Exodus 12:2) and commanded the Israelites to forever observe this event each year in memory of their salvation from Egyptian bondage, delivered by God's mighty power and outstretched hand. Here, a lamb would be a sufficient sacrifice for a household.

In Leviticus we find extensive detail regarding how Israel was to perform their animal sacrifices. Chapters 16 and 23 explain how the priest would offer atonement for himself and for the people. Blood had to be shed before God's people were considered clean before Him. Hebrews 9:22 states that "under the Law almost everything is purified in blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins." The writer goes on to say that Christ has been offered once to bear the sins of many (9:28); whereas in the Old Testament the sacrificial system was near continuous. During this stage in redemptive history a sacrifice was sufficient for the nation.

In the Gospel of John, we see a long-awaited declaration. In John 1:29, John the Baptist shouts for all to hear: "Behold the Lamb of

God, who takes away the sins of the world!" the Son of God has graciously arrived to live and die as our sacrifice. Jesus himself will pay and then cancel our costly sin debt. He alone will justify fallen mankind before a Holy and Righteous God and thereby usher peace between us. In His brutal crucifixion, death, burial, and glorious resurrection Jesus Christ would die on our behalf so that we may live and reign with Him forever. Think about that. This is what we celebrate. The long-awaited moment came 2000 years ago. We look back to the cross in recognition that what happened to Jesus physically happened to every believer spiritually. Our union with Christ in salvation ensures that He is our sinbearer through His sacrificial death and alorious resurrection done on our behalf. Paul writes to the Ephesians, "In Him we have our redemption through His blood, forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace" (1:7).

As Jesus died for sin, so did we. As He rose from the dead, so will we (Romans 6:3-5). He is the beginning and the end, the author and finisher of our salvation who will bring His work to completion (Philippians 1:6), praise God!

And so, we see that in Genesis a sacrifice was sufficient for an individual. In Exodus, it would cover the sins of the household. In Leviticus. the sacrifice would atone for the sins of the nation. And in the Gospel, the Lamb of God takes away the sins of the world. "World" in this sense refers to the vast variety of believers who have come and will continue to come from "every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages" (Revelation 7:9), who will join together in eternal worship before God's throne in a great multitude no one can number. We know this because Jesus' sacrifice is more than adequate and universal in its provision, yet it is not universal in its application. The entire "world" is not saved. His work of atonement and redemption is therefore perfectly applied to God's people whom He calls by name out of spiritual death and into new spiritual life (John 5:21, 10:3-4, 11, 27-28, Colossians 1:13-14, Ephesians 1:3-14, 2:1-10). To God alone be the glory.

So, we see that a sacrifice has always been necessary, and, it had to be perfect without spot or blemish. Interestingly, the sacrifices were inspected by the priest first before being slaughtered. Likewise, the Lamb of God was inspected by Pontius Pilate first before being scourged and crucified. After intense observation and questioning of Jesus, Pilate concluded not once but three separate times: "I find no guilt in Him" (John 18:38, 19:4, 6). The perfectly spotless and innocent Lamb of God was in the end falsely declared "guilty" while guilty mankind was declared "innocent"

– and clothed in his own righteousness (2 Corinthians 5:21). Just as Barabbas was guilty yet freed; so was I, and so were you. We were guilty, godless, unrighteous – but Jesus set us free. For what? To go on living for ourselves and our own pleasures? Of course not. Jesus died so that we might live with Him and for Him. Paul writes the Galatians, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself up for me (Galatians 2:20). Can you say this like Paul did?

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the celebration of victory over bondage to sin, separation from God, and spiritual death. It is the sign that our sin debt has been graciously paid in full by Christ and is accepted by God the Father. We now have peace with God. We are His children forever. We've been called, justified, sanctified, glorified, and fully redeemed. And the cross and His empty tomb are both timeless proof of that.

Thank Him today, thank Him always. And remember, now WE are the sacrifice. As God's people we lay down our lives as "living sacrifices" to Him, for His purposes, and for His eternal glory. This is our reasonable service (Romans 12:1-2).

May this Easter unite believers in celebration of God's amazing and timeless provision for sin. The glimpses God reveals to us throughout the Old Testament have been perfectly revealed in the New Testament. Praise Him today!

I went from having everything to having nothing, and to becoming what I use to call them a crack head. I was working hard and selling a lot of crack, and I was working on the sanitation dept. in Spring Hope N.C. I had been out selling all night, but I was tired of the way I was living because I knew the Feds were coming to get me. I used to pray to God to take this addiction to alcohol and money away from me, and it was like He was listening to me. The next day I was thrown from the back of the truck, and I was air lifted to Pit County from Nash General of Rocky Mount. They said I wasn't going to make it, and if I did, I wouldn't work or be able to, or I had a very slim chance of getting my mind back. The glory goes to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, because I am just as good today as I was then. I've learned to love others as I loved myself. God has blessed me with gifts of writing, drawing, and my best gift, cutting hair. I learned on my own, but the best gift I have is the gift of giving back. I don't judge people for what they have done. Drugs and alcohol have destroyed a lot of lives, because without those in our lives, there are a lot of talents behind these closed doors. I promise God to never sell or drink, or to do any of those things that got me here again. MasterLife has gave me a lot of key verses into making my life easier for me. I'm not where I want to be, but where I need to be so God can finish making me the man I need to be for Him. To be a warrior for Jesus takes time, and patience! Only love can guide us to be a great disciple. 1st, learn how to love yourself, and then you can love others. Just pray and study God's Word every day is all I need to do, and it blesses to my soul. I am thankful for the class, thank you!
