They claim that the recipient owes money because the department overpaid some benefits by mistake and they want the victims to pay it back. If our members do or do not think they owe money to the VA they should visit the VA's website at Manage Your VA Debt For Benefit Overpay-ments And Copay Bills | Veterans Affairs so that they can check the status of their accounts.


Greetings Legion Family Members

To All Squadrons of District One,

I hope this message finds each of you in good health and high spirits as we continue our collective mission of honoring our veterans, supporting our communities, and upholding the values of The American Legion Family.

Today, I'm writing to stress the critical importance of submitting membership renewals, and new applications early in the membership year. As many of you are aware, we're currently seeing what we often refer to as "goose eggs" or — zeros — next to several squadrons when it comes to renewals and new member submissions. These early returns are absolutely vital to District-level planning and the momentum we carry into the new membership year.

This isn't just about numbers; it's about setting a tone. Early membership submissions show vitality, commitment, and leadership. Our detachment and national leadership pay close attention to those initial reports, and strong early activity reflects positively on every one of us in District One.

Commander Erickson, East Vice Commander Brian Tomashek, and I all recognize and deeply appreciate the work that each squadron does. However, we are unified in emphasizing that getting memberships submitted earlier — rather than later — is more than a best practice, it's a necessity. It boosts morale, increases our visibility at the state level, and improves our ability to secure resources and support throughout the entire year.

Let's make it our shared goal to get off the goose egg as fast as possible — not just to meet quotas but to set a standard of excellence for the rest of the districts. If your squadron has renewals or new members ready to go, please prioritize sending those applications in immediately, again on line is best.

New this year, are \$100.00 awards and plaques for 1^{st} @ goal, and highest % of increase. There will also be a random drawing and a \$100.00 award given to one squadron of all squadrons who turn in a consolidated report. The winners will also be noted in our district newsletter and the state Legionnaire paper.

I also want to remind you about the Paid-Up-For-Life (PUFL) Membership Program—a convenient and cost-effective option that frees you from the yearly dues cycle.



New resources are available for American Legion Family members to use in support of the <u>"Be the One" initiative</u> to reduce the rate of veteran suicide.

The web page (betheone.org) has been updated with a variety of resources. Among them:

A set of brochures available for download. One brochure is a PDF that can be used to educate agencies with mental health services, community partners, local government leaders and others about Be the One. The other brochure is a Word document that can be downloaded and customized for posts to use at suicide awareness events. The entire back page of the trifold is intentionally left blank (other than directions, which can be deleted) so that posts can fill it with local resources.

Branding materials: A variety of approved American Legion Be the One promotional materials that posts can use to promote the initiative.

Content, including the special two-part magazine series on Be the One. The series includes stories and snippets about how American Legion members and posts are actively participating in events geared toward reducing the stigma associated with mental health counseling.

Video links: Vimeo playlist includes videos that can be downloaded and played while offline. They can be shared on social media, posted to the web and played at post events.

Additionally, headquarters staff has created <u>a QR Code</u> for the Be the One page. This can be used to direct others to find information and resources related to the campaign.

How to scan a QR code:

- 1. Open the Camera app on your phone.
- 2. Make sure you are using the rear facing camera.
- 3. Hold your device so the QR code appears in the viewfinder in the Camera app.
- 4. Once steady, your device will recognize the QR code and show a notification.
- 5. Tap the notification to open the link.


