My apologies if you are already aware of this, but I wanted to be sure we can spread the word for those that may not be aware The victims are receiving e-mails, phone calls and letters that appear to be from Department of Veterans Affairs. They claim that the recipient owes money because the department overpaid some benefits by mistake and they want the victims to pay it back. If our members do or do not think they owe money to the VA they should visit the VA's website at Manage Your VA Debt For Benefit Overpayments And Copay Bills | Veterans Affairs so that they can check the status of their accounts.

Good morning!

I just want to bring you up to date on some things happening in the Department. Don't keep this news to yourself, share it with the posts!

I know some of you have already received this from the Department Membership Director, but as of September 22 we are still sitting in 4th place Nationally for Membership. As of September 24th we are at 63.3% membership and our retention rate is 61.81%. This means we have already made the October 15th cutoff and are close to the November 13th cutoff of 65%. We always seem to hit a wall come January and our membership seems to slide downward from there. We need to keep our momentum going all through the year. Open Houses, Revitalizing posts that are struggling are some ways to help stop this slide.

Minnesota Legion College will be April 23-26 at Camp Ripley, register now to ensure you have a seat, we are already getting students registered and the maximum number of students is 24, don't miss your opportunity to gain valuable information.

This is a learning Conference, we have several classes lined up which are designed to help both Posts and Districts, this is also where we honor our Outstanding Military members. Also we will be having a joint service project with the Auxiliary and SAL. Please see attached flyer and help make this project a success.

We have gone from a monthly Legionnaire to once every six weeks. 
AN UP DATE ON SHARON HAMMON

He is expected to begin his recovery in the VA's inpatient Physical Therapy unit and will be transferred to a short-term rehabilitation center to continue healing. This will be a long and challenging journey, but Mark's strength and spirit remain steadfast.





The web page (betheone.org) has been updated with a variety of resources. Among them:

A set of brochures available for download. One brochure is a PDF that can be used to educate agencies with mental health services, community partners, local government leaders and others about Be the One. The other brochure is a Word document that can be downloaded and customized for posts to use at suicide awareness events. The entire back page of the trifold is intentionally left blank (other than directions, which can be deleted) so that posts can fill it with local resources.

Branding materials: A variety of approved American Legion Be the One promotional materials that posts can use to promote the initiative.

Content, including the special two-part magazine series on Be the One. The series includes stories and snippets about how American Legion members and posts are actively participating in events geared toward reducing the stigma associated with mental health counseling.

Video links: Vimeo playlist includes videos that can be downloaded and played while offline. They can be shared on social media, posted to the web and played at post events.

Additionally, headquarters staff has created <u>a QR Code</u> for the Be the One page. This can be used to direct others to find information and resources related to the campaign.




