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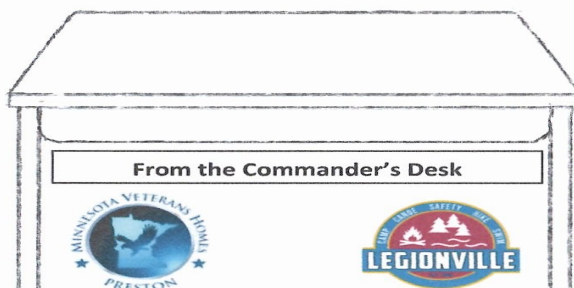

ADJUTANT'S

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In the movie *Starship Troopers*, actor Michael Ironside plays Civics teacher Jean Raszak. Prior to being a teacher, he served in the military and does get recalled. In one class, he discusses the benefits of service. In this futuristic world, service gives you the right to vote, live where you want, continue onto higher education (of your choosing), and have children.

Yes, you must earn these rights. How fortunate we are to live in a country where we are accorded these rights by our Republic. How sad it is to know how few take advantage of them. A LinkedIn Poll, [2024 Civic Engagement](#), showed that 79.7% of Veterans are registered to vote. Only 71% voted. That is better than the rest of the overall population, non-veterans are on voting around 50% when they are enthusiastic about the topic or person. We have to do better. The poll goes on to show that older vets are turning out in higher numbers than younger vets; this is also in line with the rest of the population. The American Legion gets it, that's why voting and civic participation fall directly under **Americanism**, is the third pillar of The American Legion.

As we enter, what will be, an energetically contested mid-term season, I thought it would be good to put out some reminders. This is all from TAL's website under Americanism.

The Americanism Pillar and Voting

- **Civic Duty:** The Americanism pillar promotes patriotism, good government, and active participation by citizens in the electoral process.
- **Get Out the Vote (GOTV):** The Legion runs nonpartisan programs to encourage all Americans to register, educate themselves, and turn out to vote on election day.
- **Community Support:** Local posts often serve as nonpartisan registration sites, polling places, or venues for public candidate forums. [1](#), [2](#), [3](#)

Strict Nonpartisan Rules

- **No Endorsements:** Under its federal charter and constitution, The American Legion is strictly nonpolitical and nonpartisan. It cannot endorse or oppose any candidate or political party. [1](#), [2](#), [3](#)
- **Individual Action:** Individual members (*Legionnaires*) are fully encouraged to vote and participate in politics, but they must do so as private citizens—without wearing official Legion caps or apparel to political events or partisan rallies. [1](#), [2](#)

Proposed Constitution & Bylaw Changes

Will be discussed and voted on at First District Convention 2027

Constitution Revision 6 states

GRAMMAR AND SPELLING CORRECTIONS

- Make Grammar changes throughout to make document tense consistent.
 - Rationale: make document read proactive not reactive.
- Add 'classes and the' to Preamble to make it correct.
 - Rationale: was, "to combat the autocracy of both the masses;"

ARTICLE IV - ELIGIBILITY

Proposed Change:

Section 1: The LEGION Act offers American Legion membership eligibility to any U.S. military veteran who served at least one day of active military duty since Dec. 7, 1941, and was honorably discharged or is serving now.

Rationale: Per The American Legion membership page and the LEGION Act of 2019 (Public Law 116-35), "If you have served at least one day of active military duty since December 7, 1941 and were honorably discharged or you are still serving active military duty honorably, you are eligible for membership with The American Legion."

Bylaws Revision 6 states

GRAMMAR AND SPELLING CORRECTIONS

- Make Grammar changes throughout to make document tense consistent.
 - Rationale: make document read proactive not reactive.

10) Eligibility

Proposed Change:

Second Paragraph: District Officers, elected and appointed, shall present documentation of an honorable discharge or proof of separation.

Rationale: IRS Letter TEGE-04-1113-21 dated 26 Nov 2013 and correspondence from Mark Seavey, National Judge Advocate, these documents are not to be kept any longer once eligibility is proven due to privacy laws.

12) Remote Communication

Proposed Change:

Meetings can be held via electronic means if members have a reasonable need to be absent. The Commander and Adjutant will determine the need for this.

The Technology Team, along with the Public Relations team, should form a committee to determine how Rallies, Conferences and Conventions can be properly streamed or recorded, ensuring privacy laws are followed.

Rationale: When the original bylaw was written, a pandemic was happening and virtual was the only way to keep things going. Now that we're past it, it's time to get back to in person. While there are valid times people cannot be present and adjustments should be made; the general rule for an action-oriented organization is presence. One reason participation is due to the fact that people are not present.

REGULATIONS GUIDELINES FOR FIRST DISTRICT FUNCTIONS

COMMANDERS AND ADJUTANTS SCHOOL

Proposed Change:

Officer Training

All District Officers are strongly encouraged to attend MN Legion College at the first possible opportunity if they have not already done so. All post officers are also encouraged to do the same; or, at a minimum, complete the online Basic Training Course of The American Legion.

Rationale: Redundancy consumes resources.

MID-WINTER

Proposed Changes:

1. Registration of \$10 and meal prices of \$15 are to be reviewed by the District Legion Executive Committee. The number of attendees at the previous year's event and the cost of goods can be reconsidered if modest changes (up or down) are warranted.
2. As this is hosted by the Auxiliary, the Auxiliary Public Relations committee will handle programs, flyers, etc.
3. Legionnaires, Sons, and Riders will help in any facet requested and capable.
 - a. Each group facilitating sessions, i.e., meeting or training separately, is responsible for their own agenda, minutes, etc., for that segment.

Rationale:

1. Prices removed so economic conditions could be considered when setting the prices.

2 & 3 Added to help facilitate returning responsibilities that had been taken on by a previous adjutant to help others out.

SECTION G

Registration

Proposed Change:

SECTION G-Registration

For planning purposes, all attendees must register at least 14 calendar days prior to Convention start.

1. All attendees must be in good standing with their membership and will present proof of current membership at sign in.
2. National, Department or visiting District Officers are not charged. Registration is for paperwork purposes only.
3. Distinguished Guest Chairman shall provide the registration table with an updated list.
4. Registration is \$15.00 if pre-registered; \$20.00 at the door.
5. Sign-in / registration will be at a convenient location for attendees and determined by the District Executive Committee.
 - a. Registration monies offsets cost of Convention Badge, Convention Brochure and any other information deemed appropriate.
 - b. One registration per person, regardless of number of memberships.

Rationale: Clarity

SECTION J

District Convention Noon Luncheon

Proposed Change:

1. The Host Post arranges lunch. Lunch is \$15; however, it is to be the District Legion Executive Committee and based on the number of attendees at the previous year's event and the cost of goods, can be reconsidered if modest changes (up or down) are warranted. The District Commander shall act as the Master of Ceremonies.

Rationale: The last two years the Convention has cost more than brought in, mainly because of meals. With this change, the host post won't have to foot the bill, which discourages posts from volunteering as host.

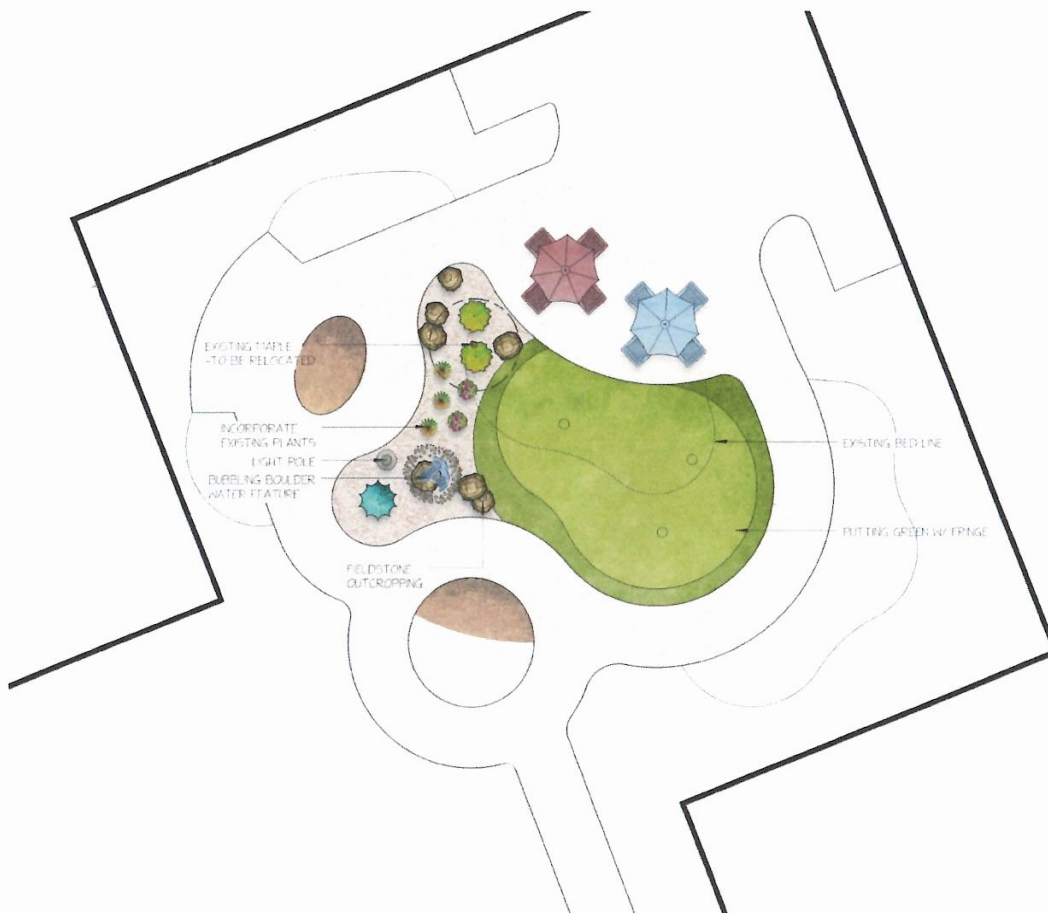

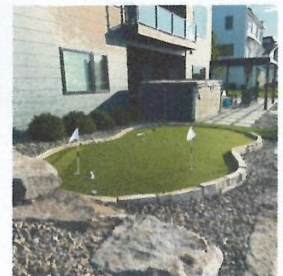

A new membership year is underway, and **District 1 is ready to make membership fun, competitive, and rewarding!** Following this year's theme, "**Outsmart • Outmaneuver • Outlive,**" our membership program will focus on recruiting new members, renewing and retaining current members, bringing former members back, and keeping membership moving throughout the year. 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Greetings Legion Family,

September 11th will mark the 25th anniversary of one of the most fateful mornings in the history of our great Country. On the morning of September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked four commercial airliners. Two were flown into the World Trade Center towers, one into the Pentagon, and the fourth, United Flight 93, crashed into a field in Pennsylvania after the brave passengers learned what was happening and fought back. Nearly 3,000 lives were lost, including those of more than 400 first responders, in the only attack on United States soil since WWII.

In December 2001, Congress designated September 11 as Patriot Day. In 2009, Congress designated Patriot Day as a "National Day of Service and Remembrance" encouraging Americans to honor the victims through volunteer service.



Thank you to all of the SAL members for the many hours you volunteer in support of veterans, first responders and your communities.

If you read Greg's membership report last month, he stated we would not be delivering packets this year but instead would set a couple dates and locations for packet pick-ups. We made this decision in part because the 2027 membership packets were delayed by a cyberattack at the printing company and there was talk of possibly not getting them until Fall Conference in October. Having no vice-commanders, and with both of us having significant time constraints, we did not feel we would be able to distribute them in a timely manner.

When the packets unexpectedly arrived at the end of July, I called an audible. After several hours and 900+ miles of driving over a couple of weekends, as well as some help from Detachment Commander Chuck Stone during the ALR Legacy Run, all of the packets have been delivered.

So please start getting those renewals in. Remember, your 2027 renewal must be processed at National **before** January 1 to keep your membership in good standing.

APPLICATION FOR PAID UP FOR LIFE (PUFL) MEMBERSHIP

- 1 This plan shall become available commencing with the 2007 membership year, beginning July 1, 2006. The Detachment of Minnesota SAL PUFL Committee shall be authorized to change the Minnesota SAL PUFL Membership plan subject to the approval of the Detachment Executive Committee and The American Legion Department of Minnesota Executive Committee.
- 2 The entire amount of the Minnesota SAL PUFL Membership must accompany this application unless other arrangements are approved by the Detachment PUFL Committee for the payment plan. 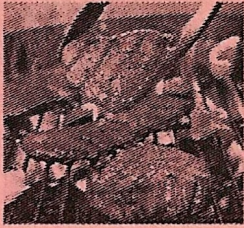
