

Privacy Notice: Collecting personal and business information

What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the below bullet-pointed information to:

- 1. provide services and goods, including delivery and third party referrals
- 2. receive donations or funding and organise fundraising activities
- 3. service updates or marketing purposes
- 4. comply with legal requirements
- 5. dealing with queries, complaints or claims
- Names and contact details
- Pronoun preferences
- Addresses
- Emergency contact details
- Next of kin details
- Photographs or video recordings
- Information about support requirements
- Payment details (including card or bank information for transfers and direct debits)
- Information relating to compliments or complaints

We also collect or use the following special category information. This information is subject to additional protection due to its sensitive nature:

• Sexual orientation information

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a "lawful basis" for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible <u>lawful bases</u> in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are set out in brief below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. <u>Read more about the right of access</u>.
- Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. <u>Read</u> more about the right to rectification.



- Your right to erasure You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. <u>Read more about the right to erasure</u>.
- Your right to restriction of processing You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information. <u>Read more about the right</u> to restriction of processing.
- Your right to object to processing You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. <u>Read more about the right to object to processing</u>.
- Your right to data portability You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you. Read more about the right to data portability.
- Your right to withdraw consent When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Read more about the right to withdraw consent.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to are:

- Consent we have permission from you after we gave you all the relevant information. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object. To be clear, you do have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
- Contract we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to object.
- Legal obligation we have to collect or use your information so we can comply with the law. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure, the right to object and the right to data portability.
- Vital interests collecting or using the information is needed when someone's physical or mental health or wellbeing is at urgent or serious risk. This includes an urgent need for life sustaining food, water, clothing or shelter. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object and the right to portability.
- Public task we have to collect or use your information to carry out a task laid down in law, which the law intends to be performed by an organisation such as ours. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure and the right to portability.

Where we get personal information from



- Directly from you
- Family members or carers
- Schools, colleges, universities or other education organisations

How long we keep information

Information will be stored securely for up to five years, after which it will be deleted.

Who we share information with

- Organisations we need to share information with for safeguarding reasons
- Emergency services
- Organisations we're legally obliged to share personal information with
- Publicly on our website, social media or other marketing and information media
- Suppliers and service providers

How to complain
