

SCRIPTURE: PSALM 10

NOTES

Questioning God's Presence:

The psalm begins with a question, asking why God seems distant in times of trouble and distress. The psalmist wonders why the wicked seem to prosper while God appears to be far away.

Description of the Wicked:

The psalmist describes the wicked as arrogant and selfish, preying on the helpless and thinking they can get away with their evil deeds.

Confidence in God's Justice:

Despite the apparent success of the wicked, the psalmist expresses confidence in God's justice. He believes that God sees the suffering of the oppressed and will act on their behalf.

Call for God's Intervention:

The psalmist calls on God to intervene, to break the power of the wicked, and to hold them accountable for their actions.

Affirmation of God's Sovereignty:

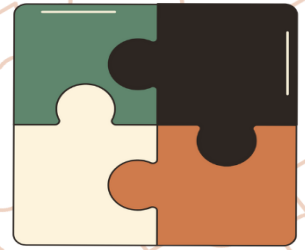
The psalm concludes with an affirmation of God's sovereignty and His commitment to defending the oppressed and vulnerable.

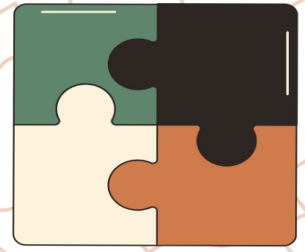

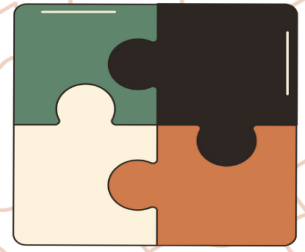
