Collection of WXRT 93FM, Chicago's Finest Rock "Featured Artist" cards from 1976 to 1988

These cards highlighted various artists, concerts, and special events broadcasted by the radio station over the years.

1976-1977

- Featured Artists: The cards list numerous artists and bands featured on WXRT, including Dizzy Gillespie, Joni Mitchell, Thin Lizzy, King Crimson, Gordon Lightfoot, The Band, Traffic, Bob Seger, Stevie Wonder, The Who, Janis Joplin, Creedence Clearwater Revival, James Taylor, and many more.
- Soundstage and Un Concerts: Regular programming included the "Soundstage" and "Un Concert" series, featuring
 live performances and special broadcasts. Soundstage was rebroadcast on Sundays at 11 PM. Un Concert was
 sponsored by 7UP the 'Un' cola.
- Ads: We begin with an advertisement for TDK SA cassette tapes, emphasizing their superior sound quality for recording music (which I used frequently to tape weekly Rock Over London shows).

1978-1981

- New Releases: Wednesdays were dedicated to new music releases, keeping listeners updated with the latest tracks.
- Special Events: "John Lennon Special" and "Rampant Beatlemania," which celebrate the music and legacy of The Beatles.
- Jazz Transfusion: A dedicated jazz program aired on Sundays from 8-10 PM.
- Listener Polls: Annual listener polls were conducted to determine the year's top albums, concerts, and other favorites.

1982-1984

- Expanded Programming: The station continued to feature many artists, including The Police, Fleetwood Mac, David Bowie, The Rolling Stones, and many others.
- Concert Specials: Live concert broadcasts and special events, such as the "Ronnie Lane A.R.M.S. Concert" and "Rampant Beatlemania," were highlights.
- Holiday Programming: Special holiday-themed broadcasts and events, including Christmas and New Year's Eve specials, were staples.

1985-1987

- New shows: Like "Saturday Morning Flashback," which revisited music and memories from specific years, and "The Eric Clapton Interview," an exclusive BBC presentation, were introduced.
- Concert Broadcasts: Live concert broadcasts remained a key feature, with performances by artists like Bruce Springsteen, The Kinks, and Genesis.
- Listener Engagement: The station continued to engage listeners with annual polls, special events, and themed
 programming.

1988

- Notable Concerts: The year featured special concerts, including Robert Plant's benefit concert for Children's Hospital
 and the "WXRT & Old-Style 4th of July Free Concert" with Robert Cray, Graham Parker, and Timbuk 3.
- Holiday Programming: The station maintained its tradition of holiday programming, including "Holiday Magic at Brookfield Zoo" and the "5th Annual Holiday Extravaganza."
- Year-End Specials: The year concluded with the "15th Annual Listener Poll Results" and a "Year-End Flashback Special" summarizing the highlights of 1988.

Recurring Themes

- Diverse Music Selection: WXRT consistently featured various artists and genres, from rock and jazz to blues and new
 wave.
- Live Concerts and Specials: Live concert broadcasts and special events were a significant part of the station's
 programming, providing listeners with exclusive access to performances.
- Listener Interaction: Annual listener polls and special events encouraged audience participation and engagement.
- Holiday and Themed Programming: The station regularly featured holiday-themed broadcasts and special programming to celebrate various occasions.
