

TREATS? THEY'RE EASY-PEASY!

I've become addicted to making doggy treats in my kitchen! No, I'm not a dog-Mom, but the neighbor dogs know what to expect when they visit. It's so easy and inexpensive and way more nutritious to mix these up at home rather than buy them. I prefer to use whole wheat flour when I have it, but white flour works just find. I find that applesauce and baby food fruits are real winners to the canine taste buds. Here's a recipe that you can whip up in 30 minutes ... and you'll be an official hero to your pup!

Peanut Butter & Apple Sauce Cookies for Dogs

Ingredients: 3 c whole wheat flour

- 2 cups whole grain oats
- 1 cup peanut butter (smooth or chunky, your choice)
- 1 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/4-1/2 cup olive oil or coconut oil
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and cover 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 2. In a mixing bowl, combine all ingredients well.
- 3. Knead dough on a lightly floured surface. If the dough is too loose and crumbly, you can add a 1/4-1/2 cup olive oil or coconut oil at this point.
- 4. Use a rolling pin to roll the dough to about 1/4 inch thick and then cut into shapes with cookie cutters. If you don't want to use cookie cutters, simply make small dough balls.
- 5. Place cookies on baking sheet, approximately 1/2 inch apart.
- 6. Bake in preheated over for approximately 25 minutes or until lightly browned.
- 7. Let cool and then serve. **NOTE:** Store uneaten cookies in an airtight container in the fridge for up to one week.
