



Weekly Schedule Overview

Members are assigned as day crew members or night crew members. All members complete 12 hour weekly shifts, 6 Saturday reserves a year, 6 Standbys a year, and several Weekend 24 Hour reserves a year.



12 Hour Weekly Shifts

Day Crew

Daytime hours are 6:00am - 6:00pm, and day crew members can complete their required 12 hours in hourly increments as they choose. Shift assignments are flexible as day crew members can assign themselves to a customized hourly shift Monday through Friday during daytime hours.

Night Crew

Nighttime hours are 6:00 pm - 6:00 am, with the exception of Friday night shifts which are 6:00pm - 9:00am. Night crew members commit to one shift to complete their required 12 hours in one night. Night crew members are assigned to a recurring shift Sunday through Friday during nighttime hours.

Saturday 9 Hour Reserves

Free Sign Up

Saturday reserve shifts are 9:00 am - 6:00 pm, and members must complete at least 6 Saturday shifts before the end of the year. All members can sign up for any Saturday shift throughout the entire year.

Weekend 24 Hour Reserves

Day Crew

Weekend 24 hour reserve shifts are every Saturday 6:00 pm - Sunday 6:00 pm, and day crew members are assigned 3 weekend 24 hour shifts in a year. Day crew members must complete 1 of the 3 assigned 24 hour shifts by the end of the year.

Night Crew

Weekend 24 Hour Reserve shifts are every Saturday 6:00 pm - Sunday 6:00 pm, and night crew members complete approximately 6 weekend 24 hour shifts in a year on a rotating schedule i.e. if Monday night crew's 24 hour shift is this weekend, Tuesday night crew's 24 hour shift is next weekend, and so on.

Standby Events

Free Sign Up

Standbys are special events like carnivals, marathons, and graduation ceremonies in which an ambulance stands by on location in case of an emergency. All members must complete at least 6 Standby events by the end of the year, and can sign up for any Standby event throughout the entire year.

EMT Class

All members are required to obtain their EMT certification within their first year of joining, known as their probationary year. We provide CPR certification classes to all members and as required for EMT classes. All NJ EMT class schedules can be found at https://njems.nilincs.net/jsp/rlm/catalog.jsp. Classes consist of 200-250 hours of classroom instruction and hands-on skills training. There may be an additional 10 hours of Emergency Department observation. The first attempt at the class is paid for through the NJ State Training Fund, accepted by many training locations. NJ EMT certifications must be renewed with 48 hours of training every 3 years. NREMT certifications must be renewed with 40 hours of training every 2 years.

Monthly Meetings

Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month at our headquarters. All members are encouraged to attend every business meeting to remain up to date on personnel matters, hospital information, and other important information. Probationary members are expected to attend all monthly meetings, and regular members are expected to attend at least half of all monthly meetings.

On Shift Expectations

On-duty crew members are expected to be in full uniform, complete any tasks and responsibilities set forth by their shift leader, and abide by the Rules and Regulations and Bylaws of the organization at all times. After all obligations are complete, many members study, watch the large-screen TV, have meals together, and socialize in between 911 calls. If for any reason a member cannot complete their assigned shift, they are required to ask any other member of the same rank or higher to cover their shift or trade shifts.
