Fueled by the geologic challenges inherent in the Canyon, the Metro team rose to the task:

- Designing bridges to withstand unwelcome and uncomfortable earth movement,
- Routing paths to avoid rockfall hazards, and
- Managing stormwater to keep slopes stable.

The complexity of the canyon is part of its beauty and the team's ability to address the hazards turned the Newell Creek Canyon Natural Area from University study into a beautiful public space that will enhance the social fabric of the area for decades to come.
