LETTER FROM THE PRIEST

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope and pray that everyone is doing well and that the Light of God continues to shine in your lives. I have become more accustomed to writing this in the beginning of my letters because we learn by studying the lives of the saints that salvation is not contingent on a specific place or time, but one's devotion to the energies of God (a.k.a. the Eternal Uncreated Light).

We know that God is Love and His Love manifests itself where the Holy Spirit resides. Light is the visual representation of that revelation. The Neptic Fathers said that where there is light there is God, and vice versa. When we are called by God to be Apostles and to go preach the Word of God, he is actually telling us to become light-bearers; not simply teaching about the light, but becoming part of the light. Therefore, our goal in life is to be illumined.

Illumination is the point of our spiritual journey in which we have reached Paradise. For some people, this can happen in their lifetime, for others it is revealed to them after. According to St. Symeon the New Theologian, "he who sees the uncreated light and is united with God is not awaiting the Second Coming of the Lord, but is living it." With our participation in the sacramental life of the Church, we reawaken our bodily faculties that have been dormant since the Fall and direct them to energies that reveal the mysteries of our creation and our relationship with God; but it is only through the Church that this can happen. Without the Church, the passions of the world overwhelm the body, and man's image of himself and of God becomes skewed; life is seen through funny mirrors and what is perceived as good is actually demonic in essence.

For this reason, we always ask from God in our prayers to give us insight and discernment. Discernment is the virtue that allows the lens of our souls, the Nous, to separate the light from darkness, thus allowing only what is good and righteous into our bodies. Christ said to His disciples, the eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness – Matthew 6:22-23. Christ emphasizes here that salvation is contingent on our purification. Illumination, or deification, cannot happen without us being selective on what we do. Our actions have consequences to our wellbeing. Whether we experience paradise or hell has all to do with how we want to see life. As stated above, since our lenses are a part of the soul, in whatever conditions we put them through is how we are going to see ourselves. Judgment will be the realization of our condition. I hope and pray that we all choose righteously. Let us not be like the rich man from this past Sunday's reading where we are pleading with Lazarus for a drop of cooling water.

I am grateful to all of you for everything that is done at Church because I know that our work is keeping us on the right path. Our beautiful parish protects us from the demonic forces that are acting in our lives today. Our sacramental life constantly engages us with the energies of God, so do not despair because you continuously fall to the passions, but be hopeful in knowing that through repentance God will be there to heal our wounds.

As you can tell from the various postings on our website and through social media, our parish has moved on to a powerful and dynamic level. Thanks to the hard work of stewards and loving guests, and the inspirational work of

the Ladies of Philoptochos, we are offering a lot more to our parishioners. By having our festivals at our Church we are finally promoting our church grounds and our faith; with the reopening of Sunday school and youth events we are able to get our young kids involved again; with the establishment of new and upcoming building projects, we are able to accommodate large crowds, thus bringing more opportunity to the Church; with the new iconography project we can visually transform the inside of the Nave to a heavenly place. All these projects act as road signs leading us to a beautiful existence. I ask everyone out there to help support our ministries and fundraisers so we can walk through it together. I pray that you have a blessed November and please reach out to me for whatever you need from the Church.

Saint Nektarios and the Protestant Who Became Orthodox

What follows is the testimony of a recent miracle of Saint Nektarios:

On June 20 [probably of 2009] we went with the Unborn Child Protection Society on a pilgrimage trip to Aegina. We venerated the grace-flowing relics of Saint Nektarios and went to his bedroom, his grave and his new majestic church, built by the late Metropolitan Hierotheos of Hydra.

A nun narrated for us many miracles of Saint Nektarios, such as cancer healings, severe injuries, even one who was clinically dead, as well as appearances of the Saint. The following is an amazing incident. She said:

"In 2007 a German Protestant came to our monastery. Some people told him to put his ear against the tomb of the Saint to hear the banging of his cane. He put his ear to the tomb and heard a voice in German say: 'You will become Orthodox and after two years you will come here and liturgize.' The German was shocked by this and when he returned to his homeland he was catechized, baptized Orthodox and became a Priest; and not too long ago he came and liturgized at our monastery."

WHEN TO SIT OR STAND DURING THE DIVINE LITURGY

(Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral - Norfolk, Virginia)

People have been asking me the important question of what is the proper etiquette when sitting or standing in Church during the Divine Liturgy. To best explain, I have referenced the guidelines provided by one of our sister parishes, the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral of Norfolk, Virginia. Their guidelines, which I also agree with, state:

The traditional posture for prayer and worship in the Orthodox Church has been to stand. In the Orthodox “old countries,” there are usually no pews in the churches. Chairs or benches on the side walls are usually reserved for the elderly and infirm. In North America, we have tended to build our churches with pews, and since we have them, we need to figure out when we may sit and when we should stand. It is fully acceptable (even preferable) to stand for the entire service. If you prefer this, it would be better to find a place closer to the back or side of the church so as not to stand out or block someone’s view.

When should you definitely stand? Always during the Gospel reading, the Small and Great Entrances, the Anaphora, the distribution of Holy Communion, whenever the priest gives a blessing, and the Dismissal. In many parishes, the Divine Liturgy books in the pew have suggested times when sitting is acceptable. Follow those instructions (it’s probably safer than to follow what the people are doing in the first couple of rows). It is never wrong to stand in church.

(Note: Many parishes also follow the practice of kneeling on Sundays during the Cherubic Hymn, consecration, and the “Our Father.” Strictly speaking, this is not correct, because every Sunday is a “little Pascha” in which the Resurrection is remembered — hence, no kneeling. The “kneeling prayers” said five weeks after Pascha, are said after the Sunday Liturgy, “reinstating” kneeling for Vespers, Matins, and weekday Liturgies only. If the tradition of the parish you are visiting is to kneel, and everyone kneels, it’s better to do so than to stick out like a sore thumb. If there is a mixture of standing and kneeling, then stand.)

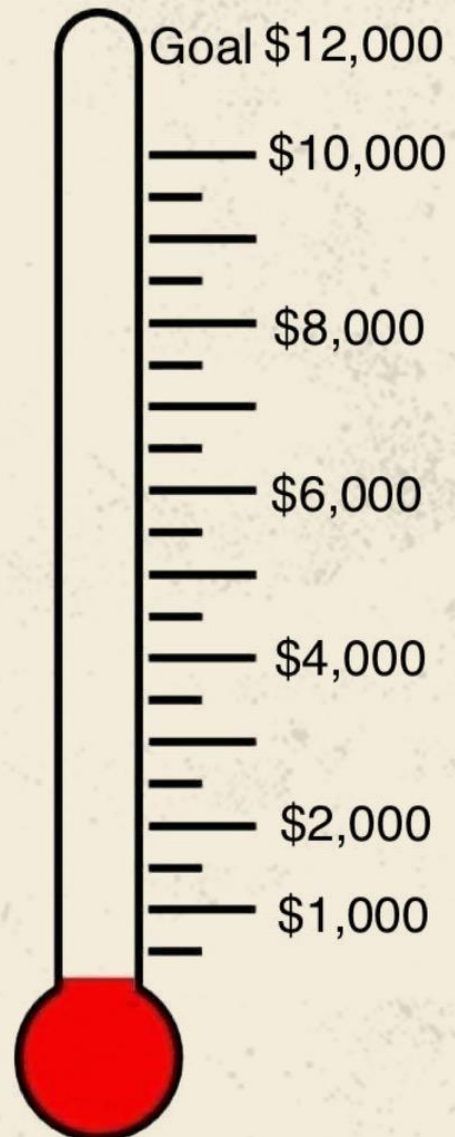
Furthermore, the issue of not being able to utilize the outside grounds due to the high saturation of water is solved as there will be plenty of solid ground to set up tables and chairs.
