LETTER FROM THE PRIEST

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope you are all doing well and that your spiritual journey is filled with love and humility. We are just past the midpoint of Great Lent and approaching Holy Week. So far, we have learned that our path towards salvation is filled with many obstacles. While there are high moments in which we feel that we are doing everything right, we seem to always find ourselves in many low moments that carry many heavy burdens which we cannot manage.

We learn next week though, on Sunday of St. John Climacus, that the way which we overcome these snares is to apply ourselves to the ascetic life. This means we need to do more self-examining and incorporate more prayer and higher levels of fasting. Just like a doctor prescribes certain medications for our illnesses, the Fathers of the Church have given us similar methods to fight the devil and his demons.

If we are going to experience the saving Grace of God, we must have as a high priority the cleansing of our passions, and finding a closer and more personal relationship with our Creator. I need to remind everybody that we are not going through Holy Week as a mere audience, but as children looking to be reconciled to the Father. It is this time that we need to put our biggest efforts to find Christ because in these bittersweet moments of Holy week we are reminded that we are still fallen, and, in most instances, very weak.

Therefore, I hope and pray that the rest of Great Lent and Holy Week will be filled with endless prayer and outreach. Let us come to the services with full attendance so we can come together as one Body in Christ to experience in a genuine way Pascha, the Passover from death and bondage to life everlasting. May you all have a blessed Pascha. Kali Anastasi!

Αγαπητοί αδελφοί και αδελφές εν Χριστόν,

Ελπίζω ότι όλοι είστε καλά και ότι το πνευματικό σας ταξίδι είναι γεμάτο από αγάπη και ταπεινότητα. Πλησιάζουμε στη μέση της Μεγάλης Σαρακοστής και την Μεγάλη Εβδομάδα. Μέχρι στιγμής, έχουμε μάθει ότι η πορεία μας προς τη σωτηρία είναι γεμάτη με πολλά εμπόδια. Ενώ υπάρχουν μεγάλες στιγμές κατά τις οποίες νιώθουμε ότι κάνουμε τα πάντα σωστά, φαίνεται ότι πάντα βρισκόμαστε σε πολλές χαμηλές στιγμές που φέρνουν πολλά βαριά φορτία τα οποία δεν μπορούμε να τα διαχειριστούμε.

Θα μάθουμε αυτή την Κυριακή, την Κυριακή του Αγίου Ιωάννη Κλαμακού, ότι ο τρόπος με τον οποίο ξεπερνούμε τα εμπόδια είναι να εφαρμόσουμε τον εαυτό μας στην ασκητική ζωή. Αυτό σημαίνει ότι πρέπει να κάνουμε περισσότερη αυτο-εξέταση και περισσότερη προσευχή και υψηλότερα επίπεδα νηστείας. Ακριβώς όπως ένας γιατρός μας δίνει φάρμακα για τις ασθένειες μας, οι Πατέρες της Εκκλησίας μας έχουν δώσει παρόμοιες μεθόδους για να πολεμήσουμε τον διάβολο και τους δαίμονες του.

Αν θέλουμε να βιώσουμε τη σωτηρία της χάριτος του Θεού, πρέπει να έχουμε ως υψηλή προτεραιότητα τον καθαρισμό των παθών μας και την εξεύρεση στενότερης και πιο προσωπικής σχέσης με τον Δημιουργό μας. Πρέπει να υπενθυμίσω σε όλους ότι δεν πρόκειται να περάσουμε από την Μεγάλη Εβδομάδα ως απλό ακροατήριο, αλλά ως παιδιά που θέλουν να συμφιλιωθούν με τον Πατέρα. 

Concerning the Final Week of Great Lent

The sixth and final week of Great Lent is called "Palm Week".

For six days before Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday the worship of our Church urges us to follow Christ after He announces the death of His friend Lazarus and begins His journey to Bethany and Jerusalem.

The center of our attention is on Lazarus - his illness, his death, the grief of relatives, and the reaction of Christ to all this. The final week, therefore, passes in spiritual meditation on the upcoming meeting of Christ with death - first in the person of his friend Lazarus, and then the death of Christ Himself.

The "hour of Christ" approaches of which He so often spoke and towards this was directed His entire earthly ministry. The resurrection of Lazarus took place in order to confirm the "common resurrection of all".

It is exciting to celebrate every day for an entire week this meeting between life and death, which slowly approaches, to become part of it, to feel with our entire being what is implied by John with the words: "When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled...Jesus wept" (Jn. 11:33-35). According to our liturgical terminology, Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday are the "commencement of the Cross".

Nevertheless, our pious people call this week "Silent", "Deaf" or "Mute" with the unique excuse that during this week no services take place and no bell is struck, and thus we do not say services nor hear bells this week. But the truth is just the opposite. One look at the liturgical books of the Church will convince us that this week is neither "Silent", "Deaf" or "Mute", rather, as we saw above, it is full of messages and theological meaning around the mystery of death. Formerly these ideas were cultivated by the priests themselves as perhaps a justification in an effort to have a little rest before the hard toil of Holy and Great Week.

The rubrics of our Church prescribe the following Services this week that are normally performed during Great Lent:

- Matins at midnight
- Hours and Vespers in the morning
- Great Compline in the evening
- Presanctified Divine Liturgy on Wednesday and Friday
- Small Compline with the Canon of Saint Lazarus on Friday evening

The only Service absent is the Service of the Salutations to the Panagia, which has a unique joyful tone during the mournful period we are going through. Perhaps the fact that the joyful Service of the Salutations is not done this week is because it led to a misunderstanding of the meaning of this week.

The final week of Great Lent (since on Sunday, Holy Week begins with its own fast) is the final uncovering of the meaning of Great Lent, which is repentance, fasting from sin, joyful-sorrow, and the rejuvenation of the worship element of the Church. Let us take care not to lose out what our Church has to offer this week also in our life of worship.

Timely and impactful as always are the words of Fr. Moses the Athonite concerning these Holy and Great Days: "Like Christ always be alone on Great Friday, waiting for the final nail, the vinegar, the lance. Listen calmly to the casting of lots for the distribution of your belongings, together with the blasphemies, the challenges and the indifference. Sunday will not come unless Friday comes first, then you will forget the suffering on the path of the Great Friday of our life. Do not be surprised, do not be afraid of the unexpected nightfall. The showers of the sky are drying up. The clear skies will come Saturday night. Then you will forget the suffering on the path of the Great Friday of our life."






