On a Wednesday night, May 11th to be exact, we had a fabulous presentation by fellow guild member JoAnne Maddalena – "100 Years of Quilts." Over the course of 30 years, the quilts were acquired at yard sales, antique dealers and some at quilt shows. Similar to bed turnings of old, we were able to sample 34 quilts from the 1830's to the 1930's. Those who assisted were able to "FONDLE" - I mean help

hold the quilts so all could see. The only quilt maker known was Phoebe Overton Punderson. The top was given to JoAnne by the quiltmaker's family. This was one of two quilt tops hand-quilted by JoAnne. This demonstrates the importance of labeling our quilts. Quilters in the future will be showing our quilts at their meetings and will want to know MORE!!

# **Hallockville Quilt Show This August!**

Head out to the North Fork on August 20<sup>th</sup> or 21st to see the ELIQG show of 50 of their members' quilts. Reach the Hallockville Museum Farm at 6038 Sound Avenue, Riverhead. Enter the property, on the north side of the road, at the driveway next to the main sign at the brown shingled house. Parking is immediately behind the building. The barn is steps away and the event is free!



Hallockville is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is a Riverhead Town Landmark, comprised of 28 acres along with 19 historic houses, barns and outbuildings, ranging from the mid-18th century Hallock Homestead to the Depression-era Cichanowicz Farmhouse.

The guild will be selling bags of scraps, jelly rolls, fat eighths, fat quarters, and yards & yards of lovely fabric for next-to-nothing! The guild will be also selling raffle tickets for three handsome handcrafted prizes: a queen size quilt in bright modern colors made by guild members and

quilted by Karen Nicholson, a smaller version quilted by Brigitte Mazzaferro, and woven rug made by JoAnne Madalena. Look for the basket raffle of new non-quilt-related goods which will interest the family member or friend coerced to attend the quilt show with you.

The North Fork is beautiful any time of year, but late summer is spectacular! I hope that you will come out for the day and support ELIQG's effort to promote interest in quilts arts. (You may want to visit Briarmere Farms at 4414 Sound Ave, Riverhead on the way home for fresh vegetables or a delicious pie.)

#### President's Challenge is due October 12th.


Save your magazine to share at the October meeting. The label on back of quilt should have magazine used, your name and the name of your quilt. Your quilt should have a sleeve on the back.

## Mystery Quilt Month #4

Remove fabric from bag #4. Sew 4 fabric strips together. Press seams in one direction. Repeat to make a total of 5 strip sets of four strips. Do not use selvedges and cut strip sets apart every 2 1/2". Need 40 units.

### **Recent Show at R.I.T.**

The Genesee Valley Quilt Club celebrated its 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary on May 20-22, 2022 -with a spectacular quilt show, featuring over 600 quilts (see photos page 5&6) including the Cherrywood Pearl collection of Diana quilts and the recent challenge of the Quilter's Consortium of New York State (see below), 60+ vendors (photos page 6), and a member gift gallery/boutique.

[ELIQG has recently renewed it membership to the Quilter's Consortium of New York State (check out the website at qcnys.org). For a list of many of the guilt shows in New York State (including the Genessee Valley QuiltFest at R.I.T.), QCNYS sells a Travel Club Passport for \$5, giving the holder discounted admission to most of these shows, ads for NYS quilt shops and quilt-related businesses that may offer a discount or treat for passport holders. In addition to the three big prizes drawings at the end of the year based on how many shows you visit (get your passport stamped at the admission desk), passport holders ONLY receive a ticket for a drawing at EACH show they visit (every basket worth a minimum of \$50). You can purchase this valuable booklet from the ELIQG representative, Nancy Pope, or at the participating show admission desk, anticipating that reduced admission at the show you are visiting.]

Continued from page 1: The **Jo Anne Powell Workshop** to be held in July (date, time & place TBD) will provide techniques for using a brush & acrylic paint to write on and/or illustrate your unlaundered quilt fabric – for individual pieces or a whole cloth quilt.

Years ago, Marie Deuel (I believe) organized a block swap between ELIQG & a Hawai'ian quilt guild. I found fabric with what appeared to be the Diamond Head volcano. I appliquéd the small square onto the required 12" block. Using a flat brush & cyan acrlyic paint to match the volcano & green for the lush foliage which covers the island, I wrote the Hawai'ian names of the city & island, as well as the English translations in a harmonious style, called Neuland. I love how writing can become an integral part of the quilt block's design!
