
IN CONVERSATION WITH FESTIVAL DIRECTOR MICHAEL MCDERMOTT

Sheila O'Flanagan is the author of more than 30 contemporary novels and short stories. She worked at the family grocery store in the Iveagh Markets in the Liberties before pursuing a successful career in banking and finance. Seán O'Connor was born in Francis Street, in the Liberties. Growing Up So High was a best-selling book in which he recollects the unique and colourful upbringing: the neighbours who lived there, their traditions, talk and lore, the music and poetry of the laneways and markets. O'Connor, father of the novelist Joseph and singer-songwriter Sinéad, tells his story with honesty, warmth and style, and often wry wit of the area. This tenderly written testament of one Liberties boy builds into a vivid and heart-warming picture of his own extended family as part of a proud community and its all-but-vanished way of life.





RECALLING THE LAYERS - MARSHALSEA BARRACKS

TAILOR'S HALL

A live airing of Patricia Baker's Curious Broadcast feature on Marshalsea Barracks for Lyric FM followed by a panel discussion on it, chaired by Emmet Scanlon (Irish Architecture Foundation).

Recalling The Layers uncovers a hidden story embedded in the oral histories and architectural fragments in the Liberties in Dublin 8, a place steeped in centuries of history and destruction. Through historical documents and oral histories this hidden story is recalled, a story of Marshalsea Barracks: once Ireland's national debtors' prison, later a tenement, it stood for nearly 200 years at the top of Bridgefoot Street. All that remains is the atmospheric locked and overgrown Ballcourt and surrounding stone walls. Architectural fragments quietly holding the past. This is a journey into the intangible cultural heritage of a community, capturing the rich tapestry of memory, place, and identity, recalling hidden stories and layers of history, so they remain part of both the heritage and the living fabric of the area.





"This series of paintings, Untold Lives - People and Places of Dublin are a culmination of approximately six years work. Many of the subjects and ideas for my paintings come from my own lived experience and my analysis and ideas surrounding social and political topics relevant to wider conversations on social justice and cultural expression. Since 2016, my studio-based practice has changed and I now engage with the public through conversation. Opening up what is usually, the private space of the painter's studio to the public continues to be a new experience for me. I invite residents from the flat complexes of Dolphin House, Fatima Mansions, St Michael's Estate Inchicore and where I live in Ballyfermot, to share images of their community through my open studio practice. Through that, local people discuss with me their lived experience and I reflect this in the paintings I make based on their images and conversations we have together. The paintings include people that I knew and grew up with in Rialto, Dolphins Barn, Fatima Mansions and St Michael's Estate in Dublin 8 and Ballyfermot, Dublin 10. My paintings are often representative of individuals on the margins, people often excluded from society, or have been historically made invisible in the city's visual representation. It is also of places, soccer matches and locations well-loved and remembered by local people. It is my intention and ambition that this work will contribute to and expand a social archive through painting, of life in Dublin city, particularly the loss of social housing and flat life in the city."





About Pat Curran

Pat Curran was born in Dolphin House flats complex, Dublin 8 and moved to Pimlico at the age of 13. He now lives in Ballyfermot with his wife Breda and son Luke. Pat has two older children and three grandchildren. An early school leaver, Pat returned to formal education in early middle age. In 2014 Pat graduated from NCAD with an MFA in painting. Pat's work reflects how inner city Dublin life is changing and how it contributes to a wider conversation about class, social justice and access to artistic expression. Pat often paints on found and collected objects that have a relevance to his painting subjects. Pat currently has a studio in Pallas Projects at the Digital Hub.






