Address contaminants promptly.

Protect your wrap by taking immediate action against contaminants such as bird droppings, fuel spills, tree sap, insect splatter, road tar and industrial fallout. Swift action can prevent potential staining or damage, so make it a habit to give your vehicle a quick check after each journey.



Seek shade whenever possible.

To protect your wrap from harsh UV rays, aim to park in shaded areas whenever possible. If added protection is needed, consider a UV protective spray or wax meant for wraps, but always test on a small area first. Remember, prolonged sun exposure can lead to color fading and decreased lifespan of your wrap.



Inspect your wrap periodically.

Do not use petroleum-based cleaners.

Petroleum-based solvents and cleaners can react adversely your wrap, causing discoloration, warping, or a breakdown of the adhesive. Instead of these harsh chemicals, always opt for milder, non-abrasive cleaning agents that are labeled safe for vehicle wraps.



Do not be rough with your wrap.

Your wrap, while durable, is susceptible to damage. The inadvertent brush of a key, abrasive brushes, or other sharp tools can lead to noticeable scratches. Always be cautious and opt for soft, non-abrasive cleaning cloths and tools to maintain the wrap's pristine appearance.



Do not refuel carelessly.
