He emphasised the importance of the general police assistance number (131444) and how essential it is to report anything that appears suspicious; we should not hesitate and the report can be anonymous. The emergence of relatively inexpensive home security systems was important to him as a method of fighting crime. In particular he spoke of the usefulness of home CCTV footage being made available

His visit concluded with an commitment to follow-up at the next meeting of AshfieldCAN by inviting the Manager of Neighbourhood Watch to our next meeting which will be held at the Ashfield Sports Club on Monday October14th at 7pm.



## Lookout Update

Slowly, inexorably we are moving to create a wonderful, peaceful contemplative park and wildlife observation platform on the border between Ashfield and Bassendean on Hardy Road, sitting on the escarpment overlooking Ashfield Fats, a wetland reputed to be the largest of its kind remaining on the Swan River and once earmarked as a residential canal development. What were they thinking!

The Lookout project, instigated by AshfieldCAN is moving from concept to reality with recognition by the totally supportive WA Department of Planning (in whom the land is currently vested) and the Town of Bassendean that the area will eventually become part of the portfolio of Parks and Gardens owned and managed by the Town. To this end the Town's Jeremy Walker is developing a management plan which should be the final step. enabling the release of grant funds provide by our local MP Dave Kellv.



#### One Planet Living

Sustainability is a key theme that the community has identified as a priority for our Town. In response, the Town of Bassendean has recently adopted the ten "One Planet Living" principles as a framework to guide how we operate and to ensure environmental, economic and social sustainability is central to all that we do. The ten principles aim to help

create a future for our community where it is easy, attractive and affordable for people to lead happy and healthy lives within a fair share of earth's resources. The Town is only the second local government in Western Australia to make this commitment.

#### **Ashfield Station Train Services & Carpark**

The Public Transport Authority (PTA) has recently made changes to the train stopping patterns on the Midland line. The A & B stopping patterns have been abolished and all trains now stop at Ashfield Station. In addition, the PTA is also planning to construct a new 88 bay car park on the northern side of the Ashfield station accessed from Railway Parade. The carpark is being prioritised in order to replace the loss of car bays at Bayswater station as part of the station redevelopment. Council has requested that the new car park be landscaped with large shade trees at a ratio of at least one tree to every four car bays.

#### **Local Government Elections**

The next local government election is being conducted on October 19. If you're not yet on the electoral roll for the Town of Bassendean, you have until the 30th of August to register (www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol/enrol-vote). The election will be conducted by postal vote with ballot papers being sent to all residents and rate-payers who are enrolled to vote.

The Town of Bassendean has seven elected members and there is no ward structure. Councillors are each elected for four years, with terms being staggered. This election four positions will be vacated and the community will have the opportunity to elect four Councillors to represent them. The decisions of local government directly impact you, the place you live and your community so make sure that you vote and have your say in the kind of leadership you want for Ashfield and the Town more broadly.





I would like to start off this update by thanking the dozens of interested passers-by I met over the last few months who took the time to say hello and share their memories about the Flats. It's clear there's a lot of passionate locals who love their wetland.

Since February I've conducted geophysics surveys and installed a surface water and groundwater monitoring infrastructure so we can gauge water levels. Those yellow posts you might have seen around the place are groundwater monitoring wells.

With students from UWA we mapped out the metals and nutrient concentrations of drain sediments and more recently started to test the quality of groundwater and stormwater in the Chapman Street Drain.

This testing is helping us to work out the levels of contamination and identify management strategies that could be employed to reduce the loads of polluted runoff entering the Swan River. Its also giving indications about how water flows through the wetland to the Swan River

which is essential information to better manage the area going forward. I was fortunate enough to be on site during the spring tide earlier this year when the whole wetland filled from the Swan River near Ron Cortney Island, spilling its banks and flooding all the way to just below the pumping station at Iveson Place.

Nothing beats being there to change your ideas about how the hydrology works. I've also sat out in the rain sampling runoff in the Chapman Street drain collecting naturally occurring water isotopes so we can disentangle the groundwater and road runoff contributions to its flow. If you're game you might see me out there again over the coming weeks.



## **River Parks Committee Update**

**Success Hill Spillway and Aboriginal Engagement** 

The Town of Bassendean has recently sent letters to aboriginal stakeholders inviting them to be involved in the development of a solution to the issues faced at Success Hill Reserve, in particular the collapsed spillway and degraded historical signs and shelters. The Town also recognises the importance of building positive partnerships with aboriginal communities so moving forward the Town is planning to create an advisory group comprised of local aboriginal people and Town staff with a long-term view and focus on building sustainable relationship. This group will be set the task of reviewing the Town's Reconciliation Action Plan.

#### **Bindaring Park Wetland**

At the 7 May 2019 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to support Concept Option 1 for the Bindaring Park Wetland to be advertised for public comment after some minor amendments are undertaken. Officers have completed the amendments and are now in the process of developing a community engagement plan. Following community engagement on the concept, a report will be presented to Council on the feedback received from the community. Melissa Mykytiuk
