Management Committee Bassendean River Parks

Whilst there are a number of river parks within the Town of Bassendean two of major significance are Bindaring Park and Ashfield Flats. Both provide ancient outlets for creek systems feeding into the Swan River. Prior to colonisation and subsequent human intervention these systems contributed to the health of the entire estuary; nurturing birdlife and marine mammals, and providing a nursery for much of the river's aquatic life. They were perfect examples of nature in balance.

There is little doubt that these wetlands are a shadow of their former self, with runoff and refuse due to industrial and domestic contamination a major cause of the river's decline.

The challenge facing the Town is providing support to groups such as AshfieldCAN, the Friends of Bindaring Park, the Bassendean Preservation Group and other conservation groups in restoring these wetlands to a point where they once again contribute to the River's health.

This link between community conservation groups and the Town is the River Parks Committee, a group that will bring to Council concepts, plans and projects intended to restore the good health and natural balance between these systems and our river. This is not to say we can wave a magic wand and return our wetlands to their ancient state, as this chance has been long lost.

However, for an amazing example of what can be achieved in wetland restoration by applying vision, science and modern technology we need look no further than the Eric Singleton Bird Sanctuary in Bayswater. I urge people with an interest in wetland conservation to visit and stroll around this sanctuary and access project information on the City of Bayswater website.

Recently, at the urging of Natasha Kepert of the Bassendean

Preservation Group, my fellow Councillor and committee member Paul Bridges and I - accompanied by AshfieldCAN members Naomi, Melissa and Jackie - were privileged to be invited by the City of Bayswater to a guided tour of this sanctuary hosted by the Mayor of Bayswater Barry McKenna and conducted by the City's Environmental Coordinator Jeremy Maher, the visionary leader and prime mover of this project.

Whilst there are significant differences between this sanctuary and our own wetlands many of the achievements and lessons learned in Bayswater can be applied to our future restoration work. We look forward to drawing upon the knowledge of our neighbouring municipality.

A number of garden friends recommended we apply for Incorporated Association status. The ensuing conversations, as well as consultation with Dr Google revealed that this would provide us with the autonomy we needed to prove our delication to the cause when applying for funding from Government and non-Government sources. Previous grant application we had submitted were unsuccessful due to concerns around access by the wider community, being on a school site. With the tremendous support of Cyril Jackson Senior Campus and wonderful Town of Bassendean we are excited to announce that this has become a reality, on the 20th of October the Department of Commerce granted us Incorporated Association status. Having this also enables us to take our insurance to protect ourselves and our fabulous volunteers for at least the next 12 months. 

Birds & Botany



Sacred Kingfisher

The Ashfield CAN welcomed Rod Smith from Birdlife Australia to it's August meeting to talk about the birdlife on Ashfield flats. Rod was a wealth of knowledge about the birds of this area.

On the following Sunday we joined Rod for a walk around the flats to see what birds we could see, in the various habitats.
