I approached my first 5th Step with nervousness, apprehension, and fear. Twelve pages of the most sordid things I had ever done to everyone around me. Many we my closest family. However, in order to continue my new way of life, and receive the sunlight of the spirit I needed to do this. "We pocket our pride and go to it. Illuminating every dark cranny of the past." As I read off each column to my sponsor, the next one became easier. What I had not realized was that our secrets gain power from our silence and we are only as sick as our secrets. I no longer worried about the multiple felonies I had just confessed or any of my other skeletons I intended to take to my grave. That is until my sponsor asked if I had left anything out. I took a breath and blurted it out. After my sponsor left my apartment, I started the hour of meditation. Problem was I didn't make it. Forty five minutes later I called my sponsor and told him I couldn't stay awake. I woke up a few hours later, drenched in sweat, yet simultaneously feeling weightlessness and illumination. As if scales had peeled from my eyes and a huge weight lifted from my shoulders. I had never experienced this level of peace and freedom before in my life. -Tony A.

### District 13 Meeting, October 20, 2024

Opened meeting at 2:30pm with serenity prayer

Went around the room with introductions

Pete read secretaries report. Laura motioned to accept, Bill Y 2<sup>nd</sup>, all in favor.

Bill B went over treasurer's report. Bill Y motioned to accept, Linda 2<sup>nd</sup>, all in favor.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Cole talked to lan about having a traditions workshop, would we as a district be interested in this? We went around the room with much discussion about this and a GSR workshop.

Laura: We have the money, and we should plan this with plenty of time in advance.

Bill B: We do need to plan this ahead of time to give everyone that's part of it a heads up. GSR workshop is highly needed as well. Maybe we should have a workshop committee.

Laura: Cooter couldn't make the meeting today but would like to have a NYE committee meeting on Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, at 7:15pm, after the newcomers meeting at Packsaddle Church in Kingsland. Would like to confirm this with district, it is confirmed.

### **GSR UPDATES**

District: Yes.


Laura went over how SWRAASA went. Bill B also shared his experience with SWRAASA.
