

A few words from Rabbi Eric about Yizkor:

Yizkor is the Hebrew word for “remembrance.” There are several brief *Yizkor* services during the year – Yom Kippur Afternoon, *Simchat Torah*, the last day of Passover and Shavuot. These are special opportunities to recite memorial prayers and remember dear-ones. It is especially poignant and meaningful to do so beyond the immediate shock and/or raw anguish of losing a loved one during the readjusted albeit diminished rhythms of life. Through *Yizkor* we can come to preserve more fully some of the qualities of those we mourn, as we pause from our routines to link their remembrances with that which is most sacred. For in our attendance at *Yizkor* services we place those relationships that brought us joy and meaning into a sacred context. As a beautiful reading from a liberal Jewish prayer book explains:

No longer can we express by deeds which might do them good, our appreciation of all that they have done for us or meant to us. Only by thinking of their lives as part of Your eternal life and of their love as part of Your infinite love can we express our gratitude for the blessings that we enjoyed in our communion with them.


