

Dear Members -

We are pleased to share that this summer, we will introduce a new cloud-based synagogue management software system called ShulCloud. Many synagogues across the country use ShulCloud for membership management, online payments, and event scheduling. Members will be able to access ShulCloud through a web browser or mobile app to pay dues, check dues balances, reserve space for an event, make donations, change personal information (such as addresses), and add yahrzeits.



Dues statements will be sent electronically during the first week in July. (US Mail for those who request this.) By mid-July, we will share instructions to set up your ShulCloud membership account to pay dues. However, we are happy to continue accepting payments through the office or US Mail for those who prefer this more familiar method.



We will roll out ShulCloud slowly and ask for your patience as we adjust. We are confident that once you start using it, you will enjoy this migration to 21st-century technology!



B'nai Israel-Stronger Connections: Opportunities for Jewish Learning and Involvement

My goal is simple, helping us and the entire congregation have stronger connections to B'nai Israel, our spiritual selves and our Jewish community. We are blessed and so lucky to have B'nai Israel as our guiding light, our family, our home!!! Since the start of my Shofar column almost a year ago, I have focused on having stronger connections to our Temple in a multitude of ways, through adult education and the many Adult Education classes B'nai Israel offers such as, Torah Study, Rabbi's Discussion Group, Intro to Judaism and Mussar, to name just a few. I have also discussed the many other opportunities for increasing your Jewish connections at B'nai Israel. They include attending a monthly B'nai Israel Knitting Circle led by Linda Goodman and Sandy Gold, volunteering in the B'nai Israel Mitzvah Garden and having the opportunity to work together with fellow Zionists to learn more about and educate others about Israel by joining the Israel Advocacy Committee (IAC). Something exciting and fun for me personally has been having the opportunity to attend Sisterhood's weekly Mahjong group, (Wednesdays at 11am at the Temple if you want to join us, taught by Peggy Klein) where I have met wonderful new friends and learned an amazing and challenging game with deep Jewish roots that I am sure I will enjoy playing for years to come.

But today my focus is on another way to deepen our connections to Judaism and B'nai Israel, and that is through giving to the Temple. A topic usually left to be discussed only on one sacred night of the year, the Kol Nidre appeal, but I am daring to discuss it today, months before we are blessed with B'nai Israel's President's Kol Nidre appeal. Why is this topic important to me and why am I sharing it with you? Because our Jewish family and beautiful Temple only exists and continues to be a resource to all of us, due to the giving that we provide to it.

Yet, I am not one to give blindly and I feel that prior to the Yom Kippur Kol Nidre appeal, we should all be educated and enlightened on all the many options that we have to "give" to B'nai Israel. Below I have set forth some of the many B'nai Israel funds that you can direct your giving to. It may be important for you to focus on giving to and ensuring the continuation of having the beautiful music that we are blessed with each and every Shabbat and during the high holiday services.

Alternatively, you may want to focus your giving on ensuring that our Mitzvah Garden continues to flourish with new vegetables to be donated to charities to feed the hungry or you may be passionate about Israel and want to ensure that our Israel Advocacy Committee is better able to donate funds to specific Israel-based critical needs or hire speakers who are experts in Israeli affairs. Perhaps you want to give to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund to assist him in being able to donate to a local scholarship fund or pay for individual expenditures, amongst other uses, or perhaps you hold near and dear to your heart the technology fund that allows us to participate in services, including high holiday services, virtually. Clearly, you do not just have to donate to the general fund but as you can see from the list below, you have a host of opportunities to give and donate to B'nai Israel while ensuring that your "giving" helps to fund and ensure the survival of those causes and areas that you cherish the most.

Some of the many B'nai Israel Funds you may Choose to Dontate to:

Linda Goodman Music Fund - funds help cover the costs associated with Shabbat and holiday worship services

Rabbi's Discretionary Fund - funds allow Rabbi the ability to pay for individual expenditures not accounted for in the Annual Operating Budget. For example, Rabbi may assist in supporting synagogue programs or initiatives, donate to a local church gala or to a local scholarship fund or for a number of other needs.

Mitzvah Garden Fund - funds allow the Mitzvah Garden crew to purchase seeds, plants, and gardening supplies needed to grow produce and maintain the garden. Proceeds go to local foodbanks.

Social Action Fund - funds allow for Social Action activities and events, such as Mitzvah Day.

Adult Ed Speakers Fund - funds enable B'nai Israel to hire guest speakers for purposes of educating the congregation for special occasions

Israel Advocacy Fund - funds allow the IAC Committee to donate to specific Israel-based critical needs or hire speakers who are experts in Israeli affairs

Technology Fund- funds are used to help purchase equipment and licenses needed to provide virtual services, programs, and simchas (such as B'nai Mitzvahs) to congregants and guests

Remember, that our home, our family, our beloved Temple, exists only as a result of what we can "give" to it and remember that giving is a mitzvah commanded by the Torah. I pray that we all give what we can for the high holidays and throughout the year and I hope that this information has helped enlighten you on all the many opportunities you have to give to the B'nai Israel fund that you are most passionate about!!!
