BIRS: Mitzvah Day



We had a fun and meaningful Mitzvah Day on the last day of Religious School. We began the day with Rabbi Eric joining us to talk about why Jewish people place stones on headstones in Jewish cemeteries. The students had previously worked with Morah Sheila to decorate stones which will be in the synagogue office for our members to take for their loved ones who have passed away. We talked about 'hiddur mitzvah' which means beautifying a commandment, which they certainly did with their beautiful stone art-work.

We also worked in the Mitzvah Garden with Morah Linda and our Mitzvah Gardeners to help plant vegetables (and pollinators) which will be donated to soup kitchens in the area when harvested. We made baked ziti, salad and brownies with Morah Dana and Morah Sheila that was delivered to GWIM in Waterbury. Some of the students opted to work with Morah Shari Lynn and her nephew, to create crocheted critters for wheelchair bound children in South America. The students loved learning how to crochet. We ended the day playing outside on our bikes, scooters, and just running around having fun. It was a wonderful way to wrap up the year.

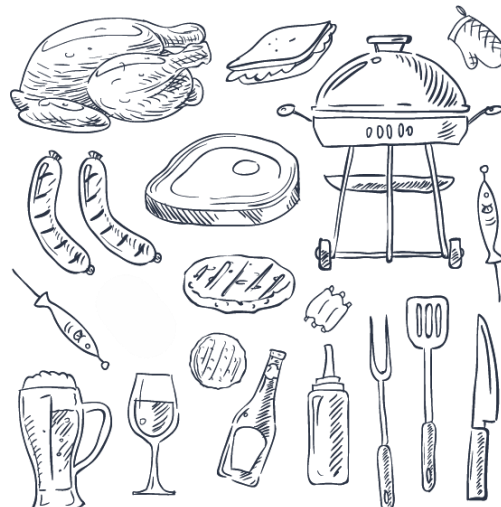

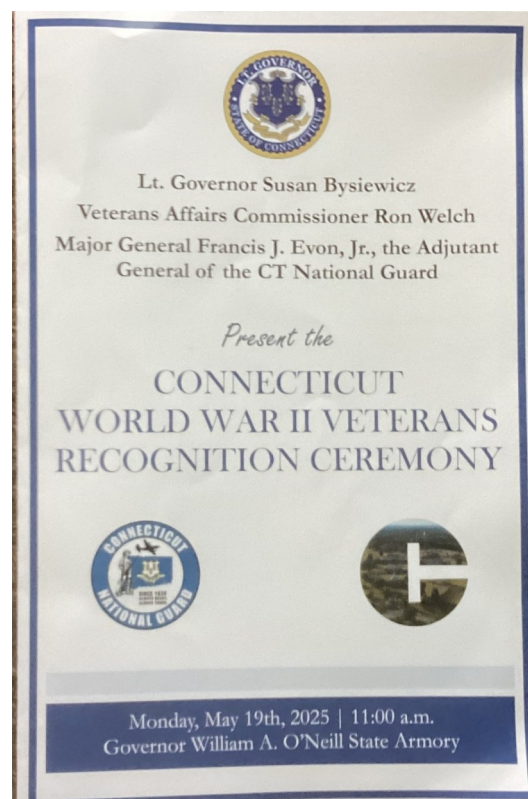

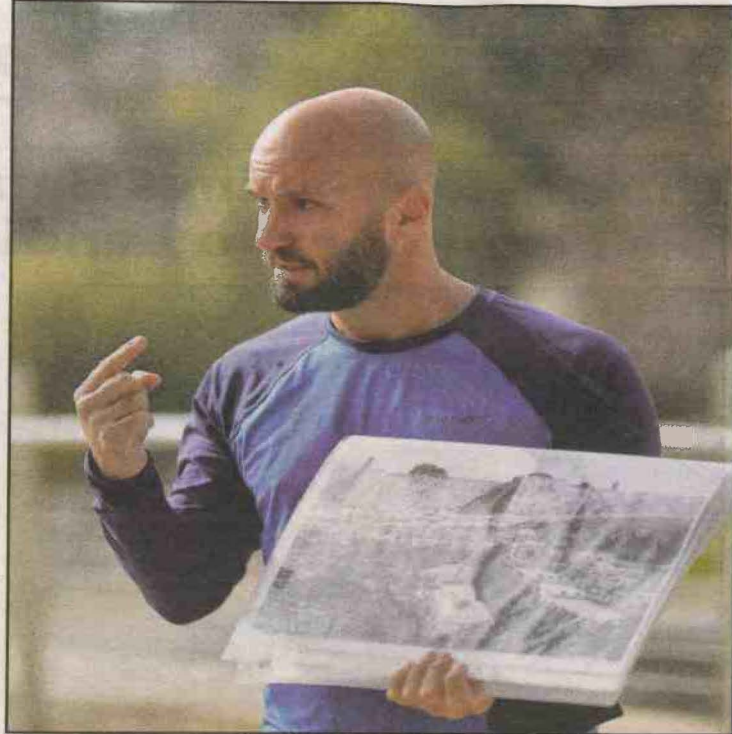

B'nai Israel Offers Online Middle East and Birth of Zionism Lecture

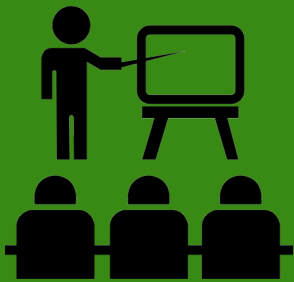
SOUTHBURY — B'nai Israel offers a free, online lecture titled "The Shaping of the Modern Middle East and the Birth of Zionism" via Zoom at 2 p.m. on Sunday, April 27.

Yuval Zelinkovsky, an engaging instructor and lecturer with deep ties to B'nai Israel synagogue of Southbury, will be giving the lecture. This program is the fourth in a six-part, free lecture series for the community sponsored by B'nai Israel's Israel Advocacy Committee, together with the congregation's partner on the Walzer Family Jewish Community Campus: The Jewish Federation of Western CT.

Mr. Zelinkovsky's presentation will examine the profound transformations of the Middle East in

the wake of World War I and the rise of the Zionist movement. This lecture focuses on the colonial reorganization of the region by the European allies, which gave birth to the modern nations of today. Within this historical context, Mr. Zelinkovsky will explore the beginnings of the Zionist movement and its development alongside the growing tensions between the emerging Jewish community and the Arab world.

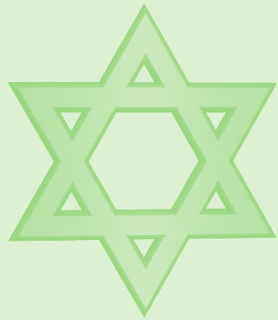

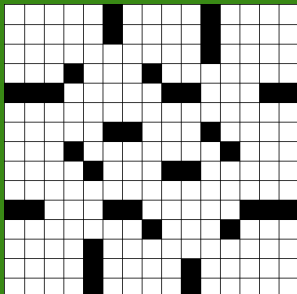

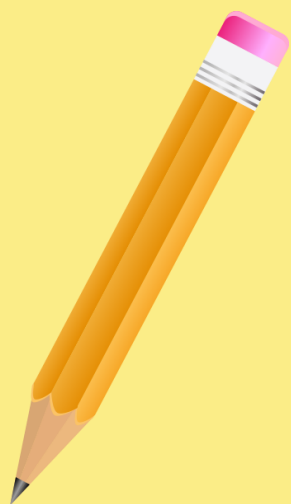
