# **McFarlane Future Fund Endowment**

Thanks to a recent \$8,000 donation, the Future Fund now stands at \$77,000, moving us closer to our \$100,000 goal. The endowment aims to make McFarlane more resilient; once fully funded, 80% of annual growth will support operating costs and 20% will be reinvested. As McFarlane is not a county park, we receive no government funding—the property is held by The Cobb Land Trust Inc., a Georgia charitable corporation, ensuring continuity regardless of board members.

# Making Personal Decisions to Aid Insects

Fall is here, and our choices affect local wildlife. Leaving some leaves, especially under oak trees, provides winter shelter for hundreds of species, including caterpillars, worms and beetles that rely on this habitat. Leaving spent plants standing also provides shelter for bees and other species that winter in the stems.
