Remembering the History of McFarlane

This summary is from a conversation with neighbor and Attorney Michael Hoffman regarding his recollection of the situation at the time of Florence McFarlane's death.

"The polo field next to the Chattahoochee River, near Columns Drive, was active at the time and brought many horse-related people to the area. Their polo ponies were pasture-boarded at the McFarlane's farm and there were stables available as well.

When she passed, Adolphus "Dolph" Orthwein, a polo player, was executor of her estate.

Orthwein wanted to pass the property on to the University of Georgia, but he was warned that he had "stepped into a bee's nest" as the neighbors firmly opposed that move which would have resulted in the property being sold into the hands of developers."

(Later legal accounts indicate that he had first tried to give the property to the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area

but his offer was declined since the property was not contiguous and could not be managed as part of the park.) The courts decided that The Cobb Land Trust was an appropriate recipient of the property to meet Florence's wishes.

It's states, "In April 1961, House Bill No. 631 incorporated the City of Chattahoochee Plantation, GA, complete with a mayor and five-man council. Richard Simms, Jr. was the first mayor. The council members were Herman Warren, Bill McFarlane, Clyde King, Fred N. Brown and William A. Ward."

From Piedmont Hospital website:

1940's

"The Piedmont Hospital Board of Trustees unanimously authorizes the purchase of property known as "Deerland" on Peachtree Road from Mr. Jack J. Spalding in hopes of erecting a new hospital."

The slate roof from Deerland was subsequently moved to the new farmhouse built for the Spaldings in East Cobb County.
