Christian Doctrine *

You will identify foundational doctrines, be introduced to Systematic Theology, and present a vision of the coherence of Christian beliefs to each other.

Ethics *

An introduction to concepts and systems by which the Christian tradition has taught personal and public morality.

By What Authority? *

You will see how the drama of the early (first 400 years) church's formation has direct connections to your life of faith today.

Connecting Sunday to Monday *

You will explore connecting faith to daily life. How do we live with our faith at the center?

We Must Plant the Church *

Understanding American Lutheran history can change the way we see ourselves and our future.

Creeds and Confessions *

Understand and express why disciplined thought and faithful confession is crucial for church leaders.

Liturgical Worship *

Explore the wide diversity of Cristian worship practices within the ELCA from traditional to contemporary.

Visitation *

You will be provided the opportunity to make at least one supervised visit in an institution and/or to the homebound, and you will be provided opportunities to relate visitation ministry to the theology and worship life of the church.
