Within the scope of the study provided by our client, Partner Africa has aimed to provide a detailed, accurate analysis of the human rights challenges and opportunities currently faced in the industry using international best practice methodologies on HRIAs.

Partner Africa appreciates that various stakeholders might have different views on the findings presented in this report, however, we believe that the information we provide, albeit subjected to limitations (due to scope, resources, and availability of stakeholders) as outlined in the report, present an accurate account of the social and environmental challenges and opportunities faced in the Small Pelagic Fish Value Chain in Mauritania and Senegal by engaged stakeholders. Partner Africa welcomes any opportunity for follow-up research to address the limitations outlined in the report (such as a broader geographical and industry scope).
