Friday Enrichment 2024-2025 Class Schedule

Class Descriptions for Friday Enrichment Program Classes 2024-2025

Mixed Media Art

Students will create their own works of art while experimenting with art principles and elements alongside learning the history and culture of many famous artists. Various mediums will be used to create works of art such as, but not limited to, clay, paint, plaster, stencils, papier mâché, watercolors, and oil pastels.

Creative Constructing

Students will enjoy constructing and tinkering with Legos, Magnetic Tiles, Plus Plus blocks, K'Nex, and other building components. Students will be challenged to build catapults that shoot marshmallows, ziplines for their minifigures, marble mazes, bridges, towers, and a lot more! Students in grades 4th to 8th will use Lego Software to design and build their own robotics creations and make them come to life with sound and motion. Some of the robotic projects include a remote-controlled rover, a helicopter, and a dump truck.

Fitness Fun and Unplugged Gaming

Students will have active fun by moving, stretching, mastering self-made obstacle courses and circuit routines, and playing organized (non-electronic) games. This class helps build cooperation, teamwork, sportsmanship, fine and large motor skills. ***Musical Theater**

There is a part or position for every child as they act, sing, dance, and learn about backstage production while preparing for a holiday production in December (may include Christian content) and a spring show in late April to early May. Exact show dates and program details to be decided based on enrollment numbers each semester. Musical Theater is an additional \$27.50 per month and \$25 supply fee.

Project Based Learning

Students will learn and practice cross-curricular skills and teamwork while engaging in active exploration, research, critical thinking, collaboration, and communication. Students will learn history and geography through activities, crafting, and playing games based on high-interest historical people, places, cultures, and events. Example projects include solving a mystery, planning a small business with models, creating a fictional theme park, coordinating and advertising charity initiatives, completing real world tasks such as designing board games, helping with charity drives, creating brochures and posters, and conducting interviews.

<u>STEAM</u>

Students will learn new skills and principles while engaging in hands-on activities utilizing **S**cience, **T**echnology, **E**ngineering, **A**rt, and **M**athematic fundamentals. While having fun, students will be enhancing their creative thinking, problem solving, and team building skills. Some examples of activities are learning about buoyancy by

building boats, constructing simple machines such as ramps and pulleys to complete jobs, analyzing fingerprints to solve a mystery, and creating solar ovens to learn about alternative forms of energy.

Classes are subject to change based on, but not limited to, factors such as enrollment numbers and teacher availability.

Friday Enrichment Program Dates-

First semester- August 9, 16, 23, 30 September 6, 13, 27 October 4, 11, 18, 25 November 1, 8, 15, 22 December 6

Second semester- January 10, 17, 24, 31 February 7, 14, 28 March 7, 14, 21, 28 April 11, 18, 25, May 2, 9

If more than two Fridays are missed due to inclement weather or some other unforeseen circumstance, during the first semester (August to December) we will have a make-up day on Friday, December 13, 2023. If more than two days are missed during the second semester (January to May), we will have a make-up day on Friday, May 23, 2025.

Program Costs Per Student

The registration fee is \$50 (non-refundable, paid once per school year). Supply fee is \$120 (non-refundable, paid once per school year). Tuition is \$1900 a school year or \$190 paid monthly for 10 months from August 1, 2023 to May 1, 2024. Siblings' tuition cost, with a sibling discount of \$50 off, is \$1400 a school year or \$140 a month for 10 months.

*Musical Theater is an additional \$275 a school year or \$27.50 per month and an additional supply fee of \$25 (non-refundable, paid once per school year). Students attending Musical Theater with Friday Enrichment classes have a tuition cost of \$2,175 a school year or \$217.50 a month and siblings' cost is \$1675 a school year or \$167.50 a month for 10 months, August 1, 2024 to May 1, 2025.

For 8th-12th Graders taking Musical Theater only, the registration fee is \$105 (non-refundable, paid once per school year). Supply fee is \$25 (non-refundable, paid once per school year). Tuition is \$525 a school year or \$52.50 a month for 10 months.

Payments can be made by cash, check, or money order submitted in person, mailed, or online or using a credit or debit card. Online, debit or credit card payments will have a 4%-5% processing fee added depending on whether you use us or the FACTS system. Late fees will be an added fee of \$25 on the 16th of each month if tuition is not paid before the 15th of each month. Payments still not paid by the following month 1st day will have an additional \$25 late fee added on. Students will not be able to attend if the late tuition and current tuition amounts due are not paid by the 15th of the following month. Frequent late payments and staying behind a month is not permitted as bill collections consume too much time that is better spent on educating and pursuing more opportunities for students. I understand that CHR & THA have a nonrefundable registration fee that secures my child's place on class registers and covers administrative work. The nonrefundable supply fee covers the use of all supplies used in our classes, science labs, art classes, and in the building throughout the year. The supply fee and registration fee are due at the time the student begins classes. The final tuition payment is to be paid by May 1, 2025.

I understand that the enforcement of the contracts and fee schedules are to reduce the amount of administration time spent on the collection process so this time can be better served helping students, improving CHR & THA offerings, and overall making even better programs for students and families. It is at the sole discretion of the CHR administration to make exceptions to the financial policies stated above. If I am in need of paying tuition on a certain date outside of the dates mentioned, or if I have a situation that needs special consideration. I understand that I can take this issue to the CHR & THA administration for consideration. I understand that CHR & THA have a strict behavior policy in place that does not allow aggressive behaviors on any level, destruction of property, frequent disruption of learning, or any disrespectful behaviors that may be considered by CHR & THA administration as unsafe or unsuitable for classroom learning.
