

A Message from our Chaplain

My Brother Knights, "Vivat Jesus!"

Sunday, June 29, was the Feast of Ss. Peter and Paul. Since this date fell upon a Sunday this year it displaced the Thirteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time and we celebrated this Feast Day. It is a Feast Day each year but it typically goes unnoticed when it falls upon a weekday. Falling upon a Sunday, draws our attention to it, and rightfully so since St. Peter and St. Paul were two influential apostles of the early Church and an important influence for disciples today.

I would go so far as to call St. Peter and St. Paul "super apostles", not so as to diminish the importance of the other apostles, but because of the great roles they played in the early Church. Many times when we hear of these two apostles, we hear of them spoken together. They even share a Feast Day, June 29. But it must be clear to us that they were distinct Apostles, who had limited contact with each other. Each played a significant but vastly different role in the life of the early Church. Peter was one of the twelve, one of the first disciples of Jesus, and one of the three closest disciples of Jesus who were with him throughout his three years of ministry. He was present at the crucifixion and personally experienced the Risen Lord. Paul, who initially was a staunch Pharisee named Saul, persecuted the early Church. There is no indication that he ever met Jesus when Jesus was on earth, but he had a personal encounter with the Risen Lord, which led to his radical conversion to Christianity. Paul preached to the Jews, but being rejected by them, he took the Gospel message to the Gentiles and set up a number of Churches in the Roman Empire. Both were martyred for Christ in Rome.

Despite their differences, each uniquely displayed a vitally important characteristic of Christian life, like two arms and hands of a body. You and I must recognize these two important limbs of Christianity and strive to embody them. St. Peter was rock-solid in his faith in the identity of Jesus as the Son of God and stood rock-solid firm in the teachings of Jesus. You and I must possess this same kind of rock-solid faith. It must be unwavering and unmovable when it comes to believing in Jesus, embracing his teachings, and following him. St. Paul was the fearless preacher who never backed down from proclaiming the Gospel message of Jesus. He took it everywhere he went. Despite persecution or acceptance, St. Paul was never silenced in proclaiming Jesus. We must have the same fearless conviction of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus wherever we go, to whomever we meet.

Being a Knight demands that we be sincere and genuine in our practice of our Catholic Faith. Saints Peter and Paul are more than just Scripture characters, apostles of the early Church. They are models of who we should be and how we should live out our Faith. Take time to ponder these two "super apostles" and how they lived out their Faith. We cannot just celebrate their lives with a Feast, we must emulate their lives as true examples of what it means to be a Christian, a disciple, who loves Christ so much that we firmly set our lives upon him and fearlessly tell others the Good News of salvation and life that comes through faith in him.


