Member Theresa Radziewicz passed away in February. We remember her and her family in our thoughts and prayers.


Election of officers will take place at our April meeting. Remember every office will be open so please consider running for one of them.

See you March 20<sup>th</sup> (first day of Spring) at our next meeting. Jeff Raymaker from Partnership Center Nest Program will speak to us.




