My Dear Brother Knights,

November is a special month of the year to remember our deceased loved ones. As members of our Fraternal Order, it takes on a special charge to remember our deceased brother Knights. We know that our Catholic Faith not only teaches but also has a rich tradition of praying for the dead. We do so as a gesture of love and support for our brother Knights believing that our prayers and sacrifices made for our deceased brothers will intercede for them before God. We pray that their sins may be forgiven. We pray that their good works will shine brightly before God. We pray that if they are in purgatory that their purification will happen quickly and come to a place with God and all the Saints in the Kingdom of Heaven.

There are a variety of ways that we can remember, honor, and pray for our deceased brother Knights and our deceased loved ones. Consider attending a weekday Mass, beyond Sunday attendance to pray for the deceased. Have a Mass offered for the deceased through your parish. The Mass is our highest form of prayer and the greatest gesture of love. Visit their graves. Talk about them and share stories about them with others. 
