See pages 5and 6, where the word "independent" is used frequently, in describing IHART and its investigators.

However, on page 7, the Panama investigation is called an "internal investigation".

"This reflects another difference between an internal investigation and a criminal investigation. In an internal investigation, the confidentiality of V/S and witnesses is hugely important, while in a criminal investigation the effort toward confidentiality is not considered except in regard to the public not knowing the names of current minors."
