



Rules & Regulations

Event Directors and Departments

- Each event director of any department will have the arrangement and supervision of all articles and animals in his/her department and is responsible to the Board of Directors.
- 2. Each director will afford the Judges every facility for examination, affix the ribbons, and when the Judges are not on duty, take charge of the lists.
- 3. Each director is expected to exercise great care of preserving and returning the lists of the awards and upon no other authority can premiums be paid.

Exhibitors having objections to any judge or judges shall make their complaint to the Secretary of the Association, in writing, stating the grounds of the said objection.

Raymond Pimental, Bermuda native, moved to Bedford County Tennessee in 1984. Raymond LOVED the Bedford County Fair and spent many years being a part of it in many different ways.

Raymond served on the Fair Association Board for several years, chaired many different events and proudly held the position of President in 2006. One event he implemented was the Kiddie Parade, which allowed kids of all ages to have some lighthearted fun. Needless to say he had more fun watching the kiddos than they did being a participant! Another event Raymond brought to the fair was the tug-o-war competition. Reminiscent of this younger years as a fireman in Bermuda, his brigade always had



a team and they loved competing against the police department for bragging rights! He enjoyed listening to the Bedford County teams following in his footsteps! Raymond also helped with the dog show and the motor cross racing over the years. Raymond advocated and fundraised for a stage to be built at the fairgrounds. He was instrumental in getting this project completed because he strongly believed the fair needed a place for entertainment and ceremonial events to take place. As old traditions continue, and new ones begin, Raymond's influences will always remain.



Maurice Armstrong

July 18, 1937 - September 24, 2019

Maurice Armstrong, a native of Wartrace, Tennessee was a founder of the Bedford County Fair (along with Pap Dunn and Carter Woodruff) and was the first President of the Bedford County Fair. His sons, Kenneth and Jimmy (and their families), were both very involved in the fair and instrumental in it's success in the beginning years.

Maurice worked many hours with the Ag Center Board, Bedford County Commission and Shelbyville City in making sure the fair had a good home and was run efficiently. After leaving the office of fair president, Maurice remained very involved in the working of the fair. He and his family could

often be seen strolling the fairgrounds, helping where they were needed. He was a great friend to all of us and will be greatly missed.



- All items must be left on display until released by the Fair during official pick-up times as listed below.
- See also any special regulations under each Department and Class.
- Reasonable precautions will be taken, however, the fair board and/or University of Tennessee/Tennessee State University Extension will not be responsible for the loss or damage of any article.
- Any article left after 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 25 will become property of the Fair Board.
- The Fair premiums will be paid at \$5.00 for 1st place with a blue ribbon, \$4.00 for 2nd place with a red ribbon, and \$3.00 for 3rd place with a yellow ribbon.
- A Champion rosette will be awarded to one entry in each Class except for Department E (Beekeeping) where one champion rosette will be awarded to one entry in the Department.
- All decisions by fair judges are final.



Beekeeping Show



All adults and 4-Hers are eligible to enter items in the Beekeeping show. Only one adult entry per lot per exhibitor will be accepted. Only two adult entries per lot per family will be allowed. Each 4-H member may enter one entry per lot. All reasonable precautions will be taken, however, the Fair Board and/or the Duck River Beekeepers Association will not be responsible for the loss or damage of any article.

Competition extracted honey will be accepted in one pound jars of queen line or gambler style. All entries must be unlabeled. Competition beeswax, lots 172 and 173, must be one pound. Beeswax entries in lot 174 can be creative and of various size. Shallow or medium frames of honey will be accepted. Frames of honey must be placed in sanitary, bee-proof container with see through sides. All entries must be produced by exhibitor.

Enclosed is a summary of Tennessee Fair Regulations - health requirements for livestock at fairs and exhibitions.

Special Comments:

- 1. It is expected that all exhibitors will bring only healthy animals to fairs and exhibitions. Although state and federal animal health officials will be performing some inspections, fair officials are responsible for ensuring that all animals entering fairs for exhibition are in overall good health and are accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Animals showing clinical signs of contagious disease should be sent home immediately. Violations should be reported to the state veterinarian or his agent.
- 2. Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection are to accompany all animal(s) to the respective shows with the exception of in-state Tennessee equine and poultry. In-state Tennessee equine six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months. Poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions should be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days, or be tested on-site prior to exhibition following strict biosecurity procedures, or originate directly from a flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the Tennessee Poultry Improvement Plan. As part of increased awareness and surveillance for Avian Influenza and other poultry diseases, all bird's physical appearance should be assessed at the time testing is conducted.
- 3. Health certificates issued in satisfaction of these Tennessee Fair Regulations shall be good for **90** days for Tennessee livestock only.
- 4. Please note that exhibition requirements for out-of-state livestock are the same as regular import requirements.
- 5. Warts and ringworm are considered contagious and infectious diseases and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- 6. Scabies, contagious ecthyma (soremouth), footrot, cutaneous fungal and bacterial infections (i.e. club lamb disease, caseous lymphadenitis) are considered contagious and infectious diseases, and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- 7. Avian Influenza <u>All out-of-state poultry</u> must originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and a H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative official Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

Also, please note that if highly pathogenic Avian Influenza is detected in Tennessee or a neighboring state, the commingling of poultry at fairs and exhibitions may be suspended.

Fair Biosecurity

Below is a summary of recommendations for fair management by the National Assembly of State Animal Health Officials and the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians to better protect fair attendees from disease:

- o Provide easy access to hand washing stations.
- o Post informational signage that includes the following messages:
 - No eating or drinking in the animal areas.
 - Wash hands frequently.
 - No pacifiers, sipping cups or strollers in the animal exhibition areas.
 - Discourage sleeping in the animal exhibition areas.
 - If human or swine influenza-like-illness is associated with the exhibition, animal health and public health officials should be notified immediately.
 - People who have influenza-like illness should leave the exhibition immediately and seek medical care. They should advise their health care provider about their fair attendance.
 - · People at high risk for developing severe complications from influenza should limit their exposure to swine.

Also, be aware of the potential exposure of fair attendees to E. coli 0157 from animals exhibited on the fairgrounds.

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

I. GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE [Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).
- H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
- (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis.

 Test eligible cattle Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
- (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter, and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

- 2. 4-H and FFA members are required to have been enrolled in the fourth grade on January 1 of the current calendar year in order to be eligible to exhibit their goats in this show and will become ineligible at the end of the calendar year following their graduation from high school or upon their 20th birthday, whichever comes first.
- 3. This show is open to any purebred breed or crossbred wether or doe. Animals having testicular tissue will be dis-missed. Unhealed wethers will be dismissed. The judge will be placing emphasis on muscling, finish, structural soundness, carcass merit, balance and style.
- 4. Goats will be weighed and classes divided by weight and sex with no more than 12 animals per class at the discretion of the Fair. This does not apply to registered does, who will be shown by age breaks as decided by show manager.
- 5. All animals must be of weaning age. Does can compete in only one category described below.
- 6. There will be four divisions shown. A market goat division is for wether or doe kids raised for slaughter. All ani-mals must have their kid teeth to show in this division. A commercial doe kid division is for doe kids that are raised for replacement breeding animals and must have all of their milk teeth to compete in this division. A commercial yearling doe division is for does raised as replacement breeding does that have lost any milk teeth but have no more than two sets of adult teeth. A registered doe division is for any registered doe of any meat breed.
- 7. All does with more than four permanent teeth will be grouped in one class and ineligible to show for Champion.
- 8. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of eight (8) goats but show a maximum of five (5) goats.
- 9. All goats should be dehorned or have horns tipped or covered to prevent injury.
- 10. All market goats and commercial does MUST have a special Tennessee Junior Livestock Program ear tag in order to show. Ear tags will be sent to exhibitor's county Extension office. Bedford County Antique Tractor Association Rules 2021

- Antique Tractors 1900-1959 Farm and Open Tractors 1900-1959 1.
- Serial Numbers must be intact and not tampered with
- Tractors must weigh within the limits of each weight class (100 lb. tolerance)
- Gas or Diesel Fuel only! NOTE: FARM STOCK CLASS RULE 18
- Time Permitting, each tractor will be allowed 3 hooks for Farm Stock. Antique and Open classes one hook per class and no one person shall be allowed more than two hooks per class
- Factory high R.P.M.'s on Farm Stock only- 20% override allowed in Antique and Open classes. R.P.M.'s may be checked at any time
- Tractors must retain engine and stock appearance. Cut tires allowed, 16.9 factory molded rubber. 18.4 tires allowed only in 6,000 lb antique class and over. Clevis or ring hitch on antique tractors must be 18" or more from center of axle to sled hitch. Also no more than 20" high with hole of 3" minimum horizontal only, and farm stock tractors must be 18". No more than one inch thickness on rear of hole. No ball hitches allowed. Two-point hitch must be stationary in all four positions. No use of TA either high or low. No spring hitches allowed. Press steel or spoke wheels allowed. Antique may run rims up to 18".
- 8. Add on weights allowed. No weight brackets or weights will be allowed to extend beyond 11 ft. from the center of the rear axle in antique and open. Must have 10 ft. weight brackets in Farm stock. Disqualification will result when weight or any object falls from the tractor while the tractor is hooked to the sled during a pull. Footage will be stopped where the tire or any part of the sled touches the boundary line.
- Must be signed up before class starts!!!
- 10. All tractors must pull in first gear and start with a tight chain. Driver must remain IN SEAT during pull with at least one hand on the steering wheel. NO BOUNCING!!! NO RODEOING!!!!
- 11. Each puller has two attempts to pass the 40 ft. mark. Pull is official after 40 ft. mark is passed. Pull is over when the forward motion of sled is stopped or red flag is dropped. First puller in class may not pull over.
- 12. Front tires may not leave the ground more than 18" during the pull.
- 13. No one is allowed on the track except pullers and officials during a pull. One adult is allowed on the track with child or inexperienced driver. Person under 15 must have track official, guardian, or parental approval before pulling. KILL SWITCH IS MANDATORY for all persons under the age of 15. KILL SWITCH IS MANDATORY FOR ALL ANTIQUE TRACTORS AND OPEN TRACTORS.
- 14. No differential or driveline alterations. Wheelie bars are required and will be enforced on all tractors.
- 15. A protest must be filed within weight class before next class begins. Any tractor found illegal by track officials will be disqualified. Protestor's tractor will be checked first.
- 16. Anyone will be disqualified for not pulling in first gear, refusal to comply with rules, non-sportsmanship like conduct, intoxication, or failing to stop when red flagged by track official. Track officials have the authority to approach any noticed violation to rules and advise procedure to correct.
- 17. FARM STOCK CLASSES: Tractors must have a factory or factory replacement blocks, factory carbs, as per tractor model. No cut tires allowed. No MSD boxes, but can run electronic ignitions. No fuel in excess of 93 octane allowed and only factory R.P.M.'s allowed. Random fuel checks will be done on all fuel tanks. If tractor has two tanks one must be empty. ALL OTHER RULES APPLY!!!
- 18. Farm Stock tires 3,000-6,000 lb., no larger than 13.6 on 12" rims. 6,500 lb.-8,500 lb, no larger than 15.5" on 14" rims. Classes 8,750 lb and 9,250 lb may run up to I 8.4 tires. No oversize diameter wheels. No pressed steel wheels if not factory.
- 19. Tractors will reweigh immediately after each pull and have R.P.M's and drawbar checked.
- 20. All pullers should read and familiarize themselves with rules and classes before entering the pull.
- 21. TRACKS OFFICIAL'S DECISION IS ALWAYS FINAL!
- 22. NO ALCOHOL ALLOWED ON GROUND
- 23. NO TURBOS ALLOWED
- 24. There will be a \$50 fee for anyone wanting to protest a pull
- 25. The Out of Field classes for the fair are for any year tractor, no duals for four wheel drive, factory draw bar with a clevis.

OPEN CLASS RULES

- Shifting of T/A's is permitted 1.
- 2. Maximum speed of 6 M.P.H.
- Maximum RPM's to be 20% over factory 3.
- 4. May pull in 1,2 or 3 gear.
- 5. Maximum tire size is 18.4 on 18" rim
- No turbos allowed 6.
