

# Treasurer's Report

It is time for members to pay annual dues for 2016. Dues for single membership remain at \$60, and family memberships are \$90. The deadline for payment of club dues is February 28. Dues may still be paid after the 28th until the end of March but will require an additional \$10 late fee. The final deadline for payment of dues is March 31. Checks for 2016 dues can be made out to 4CFF, or Fourth Corner Fly Fishers and mailed to Fourth Corner Fly Fishers, P. O. Box 1543, Bellingham, WA 98227. Persons unable to participate in club activities in 2016 may petition the Board for a leave of absence of up to two years.

The board is in the process of constructing the 2016 annual budget. Committee chairs have been provided with 2015 profit and loss statements for their respective committees, and should communicate their requests for their 2016 budgets to the club president. Present bank account balances as of January 5, 2016 were \$1,785 (Club Checking), \$13,847 (Club Savings) and \$16,785 (Conservation Savings).

# Monthly Meeting

This month's general meeting of the 4th Corner Fly Fishers will be held at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club on Thursday, January 28, 2015. The Wet Fly will begin at 6pm with dinner at 6:45. The program will begin at 7:30 and will be followed by the general membership meeting.

This month there will be two parts to our program. First, we are fortunate to be able to honor the club award winners from 2015 during our annual awards ceremony. This is a great opportunity to come and learn more about what some of your fellow club members have been up to this year and honor some of our outstanding contributors! The second part of the program will feature Gabe Epperson, Conservation Director from the Whatcom Land Trust (WLT). Gabe is coming at the invitation of Dan Coombs and the 4CFF Conservation Committee so that we can all learn about the activities of the WLT and consider how we might partner with them on upcoming projects. Here is some additional info about Gabe and the WLT.

Gabe has a background in Urban Planning and large-scale environmental planning with a focus on public outreach. He was the Planning Director at Envision Utah for 5 years, completing the Blueprint Jordan River and Wasatch Canyons Tomorrow projects, which included thousands of Utah residents and led to the formation of the Jordan River Commission and the protection of hundreds of acres of wildlife habitat and recreation lands in the Salt Lake metro area. Mr. Epperson moved to Bellingham in June last year to do land acquisition and conservation planning for the WLT.

For over 30 years the Whatcom Land Trust has been working to protect critical wildlife habitat, farms and recreational lands, by securing ownership interest in properties and promoting stewardship. As part of the 30 year anniversary, the Land Trust has recently completed a Land Conservation Plan which outlines geographic focal areas throughout the county and identifies strategies to accomplish its mission. Gabe will be presenting an overview of the new plan and highlighting a few areas in the county that he is currently working to protect critical fish habitat.

As most of you know, we have become stewards of a sizable portion of the new Squalicum Creek project which will provide prime salmon spawning habitat right here in the center of Bellingham. Currently we are walking this stretch of the creek and giving feedback as to presence or absence of spawning redds, progress of the new plantings, and any changes that occur along our stretch. A few days ago I observed the first signs of beaver activity along the creek so that is a positive change. We are walking this reach of Sq. Creek every couple of weeks now so give me a call and join us for one of these trips. It takes about a hour to accomplish.

We are very pleased to announce that Nooksack Salmon Enhancement Assoc is currently occupying their newly purchased property and has invited the members of 4CFF to a tour of their new facility on Saturday January 30 at 9:30 AM. 
