### 4CFF's Donation to Whatcom Land Trust: Helping Fishers and the Environment

Whatcom Land Trust recently received news that one of their grant requests was ranked within the top 10 grant applicants for the [WA] State Department of Ecology's Floodplains by Design competition. WLT feels confident that should be getting a \$500,000 grant for acquisition and restoration of 20 acres in the lower Middle Fork River floodplains adjacent to the River. The WLT restoration effort, when implemented will result in increased public access/fishing accessibility.

In addition, another grant application is currently in play. This involves Skookum Creek, the largest tributary of the South Fork Nooksack. The Skookum Creek Corridor Project is a 1,000-acre acquisition along Skookum Creek from just upstream of its confluence with the South Fork Nooksack to just upstream of where Skookum Creek and Arlecho Creek meet, approximately 1.5 miles of prime habitat. The project will acquire a forested riparian corridor along this Skookum Creek complex of streams and wetlands that averages about 500' feet wide on each side of Skookum Creek, plus a mile long segment of the Hutchinson creek headwaters, which is the most critical watershed for Steelhead. Estimated price: \$1.75 to \$2.25 million, pending appraisal.



### Conservation Pluviophiles Unfence!








