As a club we may circulate a letter in the near future that will give support to the Wild Fish Conservancy's efforts to protect our sound from the harmful effects of these operations. In addition, we are hoping to have Kurt give us a program later in 2018 as an update on how this issue is playing out in the state legislature.




