## Monthly Meeting

On THURSDAY, December 15 we will once again gather at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club to celebrate the holiday season with fishing buddies old and new!

The social hour begins at 6pm and dinner will be served at 7. The dinner will begin with bread + butter and a salad of field greens, feta, cucumber, carrots and pumpkin seeds witha balsamic vinagrette dressing. You will have a choice of three entrées (please specify your choice when you make your reservation): a 5 oz. baseball steak with a wild mushroom demi glaze, honey mustard chicken with BelleWood Acres apples, or butternut squash ravioli with sage butter sauce (vegetarian). The entrées will be paired with a side of smashed Yukon potatoes and a seasonal vegetable. The dinner will conclude with apple pie with vanilla bean whipped cream for dessert.

Dinner is \$35 per plate, payable upon arrival. As usual, a cash bar stocked with all your favorite libations will be available.

In addition to the wonderful holiday meal, there will be a number of fun opportunities to exchange gifts and perhaps win a nice prize.

The rod includes a 230 grain Sage Bass Taper line which is perfectly balanced for the rod and includes a cordura lined Sage rod/reel case, along with Sage's unconditional lifetime warranty. This is a super fun and very accurate rod that excels at placing tight



casts into the nooks and crannies of shoreline vegetation and structure where the big bluegill live. The rod blank is a beautiful shade of green with attractive red guide wraps and well-suited to this festive time of year. There is no limit to the number of tickets you can purchase for the rod raffle.

We will have our traditional gift exchange as well. If you wish to participate, bring a wrapped gift valued at \$25 or less and you will receive a number. When your number is drawn you will be invited to select a gift from the gift exchange table. You are welcome to choose your own gift, but where would be the fun in that?

# Communications Report


