The Confluence Fly Shop and the 4th Corner Fly Fishers are pleased to welcome Phil to Bellingham for a lively evening as he presents on Tactics and Strategies for Stillwater Trout. The event will be held at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club on Wednesday, February 18th.

Doors open at 5pm and the evening begins with an extended social time / happy hour from 5 until 6:30. A delicious buffet dinner will be served at 6:30 and the program will at 8pm. Here's a brief biography of Phil:

Phil Rowley has been fly fishing for over 30 years. His love of fly fishing has taken him across North America in pursuit of trout, Atlantic and Pacific salmon, char, pike, walleye and numerous other species on the fly. But Phil is best known for his stillwater exploits.

A former commercial fly tyer, Phil has written for almost every major fly fishing publication in North America. He has authored three books and numerous feature articles and two regular columns. Phil's first book Fly Patterns for Stillwaters is a best seller. In addition to his writing, Phil has four instructional DVD's. In 2007, Phil was a member of the gold medal winning team at the Canadian Fly Fishing championships.

When he isn't on the water Phil Rowley travels North America performing at outdoor shows, providing seminars, speaking to fly clubs and conducting fly-fishing schools. Phil also provides instructional stillwater guiding on the lakes located a short distance from his Edmonton area home.

Phil has appeared on a number of T.V. shows including, BC Outdoors Sports Fishing, Sport Fishing B.C., Fishing Alberta, Fishing with Shelly and

Courtney and Let's Go Outdoors. Phil is presently one of the co-hosts of the New Fly Fisher, an educational fly fishing production.


The second item is a summary of a situation with WDFW and their stocking program for Squalicum Lake. At their meeting on Tuesday (2/3), the board discussed recent communications from WDFW that suggest they might discontinue stocking triploid rainbows in Squalicum Lake. This seems to have come from their misinterpretation of the creel census information we've been providing them. Perhaps as few as one in ten people who fish there actually fill out the cards, so it might seem that the lake gets too little use to make stocking worthwhile. But FCFF members who go there know that the lake gets plenty of use and that the chance of occasionally catching a larger fish along with the smaller, more numerous cutthroat is a real attraction.

The board agreed that the Conservation Committee chair, Dan Coombs, should contact WDFW and try to set them straight. Additional suggestions included better signage at the lake to get more folks who fish there to fill out cards. We could also provide them with a letter signed by as many club members as possible at the next meeting. WDFW will start making decisions for their stocking program in March, so steps should be taken this

month. More details should be available by our February meeting.
