President's Message

February President's Message

Last month we had our largest turnout yet for a virtual club meeting, with numerous guests, good fishing stories and an exciting tropical presentation to get us all dreaming of vacations and traveling again. This month is back to a love of mine and many of you, dry fly fishing, with Skip Morris.

Locally we are off to a strong start for the year for fishing and fish. If you're feeling a bit of cabin fever after all the grey, we've been lucky to see quite a few sun breaks and WDFW says we can now fish for steelhead (and also bull trout, and whitefish) on the Skagit until April 15. Fishing only Saturday through Tuesday from the Dalles bridge in Concrete up to the Cascade Rd bridge in Marblemount - single fly, barbless, catch and release. The Sauk is also open same days from the mouth up to the Sauk Prairie bridge. And closer to home, the North Fork Nooksack is still open until February 15th from the Hwy 9 bridge up to the Kendall Ck hatchery. With the cooler weather the flows have been fishable and the water quite clear so I'm hoping to sneak in a few more hours on the Nooksack before it closes.

And for the fish, from a conservation perspective they are off to a good start. Another salmon farm has left Puget Sound, as Cooke Aquaculture removed another of its net pens. This one was inside the Orchard Rocks Conservation Area near Bainbridge island that had a history of viral outbreaks and sea lice infestations. Recently British Columbia also announced that it would be decommissioning 19 fish farms in the Discovery Islands / Campbell River area over the next 18 months.

The big fish news of the year so far is a proposal from Idaho congressman Mike Simpson for a \$34 billion infrastructure and clean energy jobs package that would remove 4 dams on the lower Snake River, much to the benefit of the salmon and steelhead. This seems like the most realistic proposal for such a project to date, with a stronger focus on local economies and infra-

structure. If you want to learn more about this, the Seattle Times <u>article linked here</u> provides a good explanation. I hope most of you can get out and find a fish this month, and join us for the February meeting. Its not as good as the country club, since you have to be your own bartender, and nobody brings you desert, but it's a good substitute for a while.


Conservation Report

Welcome to the second month of 2021. Hopefully you are all staying safe!



Monthly Zoom Meeting

February Zoom Presenter is **Skip Morris**

Skip Morris is among the most prolific fly-fishing and fly-tying authors alive—his name is known to anglers around the world as a noted fly fishing author and speaker. Over the many years that Skip Morris has fished and written about fly fishing, he's uncovered many nuggets of information that have helped him and others to catch more fish. Whether it's trout, bass or panfish Skip has something to share that will improve your odds. Perhaps you heard him as a presenter at the a Lynnwood Fly Fishing Show.

As a speaker and clinician, Skip is well-known as an entertaining, concise, and knowledgeable presenter, with a sly sense of humor and an easygoing manner that draws in the audience. As our presenter for February, Skip will do a fly tying demonstration for us during his zoom presentation.

He has written twenty-one books on fly fishing and tying, including the established standard beginning fly tier's volume *Fly Tying Made Clear and Simple*, and *The Art of Tying the Bass Fly*, *Morris & Chan on Fly Fishing Trout Lakes* (with lake-fishing guru Brian Chan), *Concise Handbook of Fly Tying*, and *Fly Fisher's Guide to Western River Hatches*.

Skip has published over 300 articles on fly fishing and tying in magazines from Fly Fisherman to American Angler. For three years he was among the hosts of the "Fly-Fish Television Magazine" show.

In addition he has videos and DVD's that range from instruction for tying nymphs, to tying bass flies, to tying and fishing flies for sea-run cutthroat trout.

He lives with his wife, Carol, amid the rivers and lakes and saltwater beaches of Washington State's wild and magnificent Olympic Peninsula.


