Prior Members rejoining the club:

I was asked a question regarding the membership process for returning members. A couple of years ago we revised the membership bylaws to accommodate these individuals. The key points are as follows:

1.1. Classifications of Club Membership: (Bylaws Sections 3.4.1 and 3.4.2)

Prior Members: In general, prior members who left the club before the new Membership policy was implemented - January 1, 2011, can rejoin the club based on the following:

- 1 The prior member must have left the club in good standing.
- 2 The prior members must complete a 4CFF Membership Application form and pay the \$30.00 application fee.
- 3 The prior member must have two current club member sponsors.
- 4 The sponsors must present their support of the prior member's application to the 4CFF Board.
- 5 The Board must approve the membership application of the prior member by a majority vote.
- 6 Upon approval from the Board, the prior member's request for Membership will be submitted to the general Membership for approval.
- 7 Upon approval from the general Membership, the prior member must pay the annual dues for either the individual or family membership.
- Members who terminate their club membership after January 1, 2011 and wish to become members again, generally must follow the general membership application process spelled out in the Club's Policy & Procedures, but on a case by case basis, the Board may approve exceptions to such general membership

This looks like it is going to be another interesting year. There will be many paths through it. Just take time to enjoy the ride along the way!

This month we're going to enjoy (and maybe participate in) a fly tying contest that I'm dubbing 'Cutthroat Fly.' You may recall a couple of years back we had a fly tying contest modeled on the TV cooking show, Chopped! This time around I am using another of my favorite food program, Cutthroat Kitchen as inspiration. Here are the details...

As you arrive the night of the meeting you will be asked to fill out a short survey about your fly tying experience. We will form two teams using some of the most experienced fly tyers as coaches and participants from the crowd as team members. Each team will be asked to tie a number of flies with the coaches guiding the process. There are two twists: (1) the coaches will not be allowed to touch anything – just give instructions and (2) as is the case on the TV show I will occasionally throw little challenges at each team. For example, I require that the coach must wear a blindfold for the rest of the round or that one member of the team loses its whip finishing tool. At the end there will be judging and fun prizes!


