


President's Message

Conservation Project April 17, 2025

We have been asked by NSEA to complete a project on Deer Creek in Whatcom County. This project will restore a section of Deer creek for coho and cutthroat trout to spawning and rearing potential. Deer creek is a tributary to Ten Mile Creek in Whatcom County. Planted and placed tree protection on 50 evergreen trees in November 2023. On going work project on conservation easement with oversight from NSEA.

I suggest that you wear waterproof foot gear and outdoor clothing appropriate to the weather. Pack a lunch or snack as we will be engaged to past 12:30. 4CFF 25th Biennial Conservaton/Education Auction April 19,2025

Greetings fellow conservationists!

As I write this, our fundraising auction is less than_one month away! If it seems like I am pushing member participation hard, it is because this auction is our club's single largest source of revenue. A successful auction means greater financial support to local education and conservation projects; and a portion of the proceeds goes to supporting club activities between auctions. We only do this auction once every two years, so it is really important that we make the most of it.



Our focus has shifted from acquiring auction items, to recruiting like minded conservationists to attend the auction. The goal is a *minimum* of 70 attendees. As I write this we have sold 14 tickets, and while it is still early we have a long way to go! I'm told that ticket sales will surge just before the cutoff date which is April 16th. At this rate we are definitely going to need a surge! We are advertising via traditional channels (including social media) however word of mouth has historically been the most effective method. Please spread the word, and do whatever you can to advertise our event. And buy your tickets as early as you can!

While our focus is now *primarily* on recruiting individuals to attend the auction, that does NOT mean that we are done soliciting auction items. Please continue to look for items to donate, or be donated (by others) to the auction. The sooner I get them the items the better, but I will accept them right up until the day of the auction!

Another way to support the auction is by participating in the raffle. I recently picked up additional books of tickets so I am well supplied.

- If you need tickets I will have them at the monthly meeting on 3/27. I can also deliver them to you. Remember that you don't have to sell the tickets, you can simply purchase them for yourself and/or your significant other.
- If you have already taken books of tickets, you can return the stubs with payment to me any time before the auction.
- There will also be tickets available for purchase the night of the auction.

 This should be a really fun event, and I am really looking forward to seeing everyone there!

Rods: 4-7 weights


Flies:

Articulated bunny leech

- · Pumpkin Head
- · Holo Worm from Phil Rowley
- · Dali Lama in olive/white
- · Sculpzilla
- · Smoke and Mirror Streamer olive

Lines: floating and sinking or intermediate We often strip leeches in the AM and use a floating line with indicator for balanced leeches or chironomids later.

Boat: A Pontoon boat can be a nice addition but this is Eastern Washington and if the wind comes up it can be a liability.



Accommodations: The Okanogan Fair Grounds has a space for us in their full hook up RV area down by the trees. Tents are allowed for \$15 and full hookup is \$30. Make your reservation online or just call them and mention that you are part of our club. **Do not just show up!** There are also several hotel accommodations in the area including the 12 Tribes Casino. It can get cold then so tent heaters are in order. If I remember correctly cell coverage is pretty good there.

Meals: On Friday, April 28 we will have a no host group dinner at either a Mexican restaurant in the area or at Loggers in the 12 tribes casino. Prices seem the same for both. Otherwise we sort of text each other to see where they people are eating. The key is that no one should feel obligated to eat together as a group every night but we don't want anyone to feel excluded either.

Directions: Leave Omak on Highway 155 toward Nespelem. Cross a small bridge (Omak Creek) and immediately turn right on Columbia River Road. Once you see the lake there is a dirt road turn off that in 8 miles takes you down to one of the two areas to fish depending on the wind and how busy it is. (Nicholson Beach also known as Beer Can Beach) If you continue on along the lake on Columbia River Road you will see another turn off at about 11 miles and turn on Omak Lake Road which takes you to the South end of the lake. The beach is evident from the road. There is a closed area along the southern shore but it is clearly marked. (This access may be closed due to construction)

Chopaka Lake Extension:

Because opening day at **Chopaka** is on Saturday the 26th some may want to move to Chopaka on Sunday to fish there. It could be busy but hopefully people will leave Sunday making room for us? Please sign up using Zeffy Questions? *Call Bob 360-961-9877*

This Story Provided by Lin Nelson...



Fly of the Month-Jigged Micro Leach

Recipe:

Hook: Hanak 400 Jig hook, Size

10-14

Thread: UTC 70d color to match

body

Tail: Marabou or Rabbit Strip

Body: Ice Dub, Semperfli straggle string or Hardline UV micro polar

chenille

Rib: UTC small wire, color of choice Bead: 3mm Inverting tungsten bead

Tying instructions.

- Place bead on hook. When using inverting beads, the concave side goes towards front of hook.
- Attach thread.
- 3. Secure tail material. Can add just a bit of flash by adding crystal flash if desired.
- 4. Tie in wire rib followed by tying in body material.
- 5. Wind body material forward in touching turns and tie off just behind the bead.
- 6. Counter wind rib forward, generally 5-6 turns and secure behind the bead, twist off wire.
- 7. Whip finish and apply favorite head cement. May add a Hotspot of UV thread behind the bead if desired.

Fishing Method.

One of the best qualities of this fly is the variety in which it can be tied and fished. My favorite colors are black, brown, olive and maroon. While this fly is a great small leach imitation it is also a very good damsel nymph imitation when tied in olive or tan. A neon bead can be used if you wish to add some bling. One of the most effective methods of fishing this fly in still waters is under a strike indicator. It can be fished anywhere from 3-20ft deep. When attaching this fly to your tippet use an improved clinch knot rather than a loop knot. Attaching with clinch knot the fly will ride in a horizontal position just like a balanced leach. This fly is incredibly effective when fished along weed beds and drop offs. Wind drifting this fly under an indicator just adds to the effectiveness of this fly.

Additionally this fly can be fished on a long leader without an indicator. Simply cast out, give the fly time to sink to desired depth (count down method highly recommended), and start your retrieve with short strips followed by a pause. Vary the depth and retrieve until you find the depth and retrieve that gets you the fish.

This fly can also be fished as anchor fly on your euro nymphing rig!! Just tie with a larger 4mm tungsten bead. BC Skagit River bull trout love this fly.

Pass Lake Outing Report

The Pass Lake outing was a success in terms of fairly good weather during an otherwise cold and rainy stretch. We missed high wind and driving rain by one day on either end of the outing. The water was still cold and the fishing was slow for some but a few folks were able to coax the fish to come out and play. You could tell when a fish was on the line because the resident eagles came to visit. It was fairly crowded on the water, especially at the south end of the lake near the boat launch. The usual flies were used (buggers, leach patterns and chironomids). Frank once again treated us to his fabulous chili verde. Thanks Frank! Despite some fishers being skunked it was overall a great day to be out with friends fishing. I plan to go back as soon as it's a little warmer. Hope to see you out on the water soon.
